


That a simple test of whether the carburetor is properly adjusted is to run for a short distance-say a quarter of a milewith the throttle practically closed. Then, picking a space where the roadway is clear, step sharply upon the accelerator, thus opening the throttle wide.

If the car speeds up smoothly and rapidly, there is nothing wrong with the carburetor. But if the pick-up is slow, this is an indication that the mixture of gasoline and air is too rich. If the engine splutters, spits and back-fires, the mixture is too lean-a condition which can be temporarily remedied by the use of the "choker" or priming lever on the dashboard. In either case, it is advisable to have the carburetor adjusted as soon as possible, for, until this is done, the car will not develop the power which it should.
