

Newly Completed Civic Club Building Finest of Its Kind in State of Oregon

The community club house is composed of 11 rooms, two hallways, a large basement room, a rear porch and a cement pergola in front.

The outside of the building is finished with shingles for siding, and a composition roof, both of which are of the best grade and will last for years.

Three entrances to the building open off the pergola at the front of the building, one entrance being into the office at the right, another into the auditorium, and the third entrance into the Red Cross room at the left. The pergola is gained by a set of steps at the right end and an incline at the left, making it possible for elderly people to gain the elevation without using the steps.

The entrances into the office is made through a French casement door, inside of which one finds a large fireplace finished with rough granite. The room is about 15 feet square and is lighted by five large windows and the door in the daytime, while a large inverted light in the ceiling serves a like purpose at night. One large radiator serves to heat the room, which is separated from the auditorium by four French glass paneled folding doors.

The opening from the pergola into the auditorium is closed by two French glass-paneled doors. Daylight floods into the room from eight windows, making the room as light as a room can be made without artificial illumination. The room is lighted by night with eight electric bulbs in inverted globes located on the walls of the room. At the front of the building is a slightly raised platform where speakers may stand or to accommodate the presiding officer of any meeting. The platform is also lighted by five inverted globes, four on the walls and one in the ceiling.

Five radiators located about the walls of the room serve to heat it while a large ventilator in the center of the concave ceiling, which is hidden by a beautifully colored glass, serves as an outlet for the impure air.

The dressing room is located just to the rear of the raised platform in the auditorium and is reached through a small hall located at the

entrance from the rear porch. A disappearing stairs by way of which the attic is made accessible, is located in the rear part of the hall, as is the only clothes press in the building.

The room on the opposite side of the pergola from the office is to be the Red Cross room, and is the largest of the small rooms. It is flooded with abundance of light through windows on the three sides of the room.

To the rear of this room is located a rest room for elderly people. Back of this is the mothers' and children's room, which opens into the children's bath, equipped with suitable bathroom fixtures for the use of children. The next room to the rear of this is the adults' bath, equipped with a white porcelain tub, lavatory and commode. A shower bath is located in the room to the rear of this, making the eleventh room in the building.

Last, but not least, is the basement, where the American Radiator company furnace is located to heat the entire building. All the pipes leading from furnace are covered with heavy asbestos pads and will prevent any possibility of fire by the overheating of the pipes. The hot water boiler is also located in the basement, just to the rear of the furnace and is connected with coils in the firebox and is also equipped with an electric heater for use in the summer when the furnace is not being used. The control to the electric heater for the tank is located in the kitchen, making it possible to start the water heating without going downstairs.

At the rear of the building is a porch which is reached from either of the hallways and from which a granite walk extends around to the front.

The wood work in the building is all finished with a driftwood grey stain, which will be finished with wax. The walls of all the rooms except the kitchen and bath rooms have a rough plaster finish, while these have a smooth finish and are to be flatted with an ivory colored enamel. The door knobs throughout the building are glass, while the trimmings on the doors are brass.

The floors throughout, except the kitchen and baths, are finished with wax. The kitchen and bathroom floors are being covered with linoleum.
