There are two energetic factions concentrating upon the election of Ralph Cowgill and Miss Hanley to the state legislature, while John Carkin is in danger of being lost in the shuffle.

This is alotogether unfortunate. John Carkin is better qualified than any other candidate for the state legislature. He served a former term, most creditably.
