



At the left is shown the usual type of air bomb making a direct hit on a battleship. The battleship's heavy protective deck minimizes the effect of the bomb.

At the right is shown he manner in which the new bombs will be used in the army air service. The bomb is dropped near the battleship, not on it. Upon reaching a predetermined depth, it explodes. The tremendous water pressure thus set up crushes in the fragile bottom of the dreadnaught and disables the engines through the condenser pipes.


