HARDING CALLED SESSION TO ACT ON SHIP SUBSIDY MEASURE

### FEDERAL BONUS FIGHT IS BEING RE-OPENED

Meeting Is Moist; Would Have Liquois Pay for Bonus and National Debt; First Woman Senator, of Georgia, Greeted with Applause.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 20. - The 67th congress reassembled today, at the call of Harding to act on the ship subsidy bill. The senate adjourned for 15 minutes after convening, out of respect to Senator Thomas, of Georgia, deceased.

The long legislative fight for a federal bonus was reopened. Congressional "wets" who linked the adjusted compensation with provisions for raising revenue by the sale of light wines and beer, led the fight. Republican Representative Hill, of Maryland, introduced a measure to pay the bonus by a levy of taxes on the sale of 2.75 per cent beer, cider and "other fermentatives."
