

INN HAS HISTORIC INTEREST

Place of Entertainment for Hundreds of Years.

One of the oldest and most distinguished hostelries in the United States is the Cance Place inn, between Shinnecock and Peconic bay, on Long Island sound. The charter of this fine, old, rambling, red-brick structure was signed by Queen Anne, but the inn was doing a thriving business years previous to this. An interesting figure is the venerable figurehead of the frigate Ohio, which, after an honorable service, was displaced by the ironclad and finally broken up in the waters which was the cove. The inn fell into the hands of the British authorities during the Revolutionary war and provided for the officers under Lord Howe and Sir Henclub as existed in those days in this part of the world.
