It measures 5 feet 10 inches in height, 3 feet 2 inches in width, and to lift it is considered a four-man job-with a foreman to stand by and say, "Gently, = now!" It is bound in leather, and eight distinct skins were used. On it are diamond-shaped spaces showing alternately the rose, thistle and harp. Three gilt clasps hold it together. This heavy tome was presented to the nation by George IV, in January, 1823.
