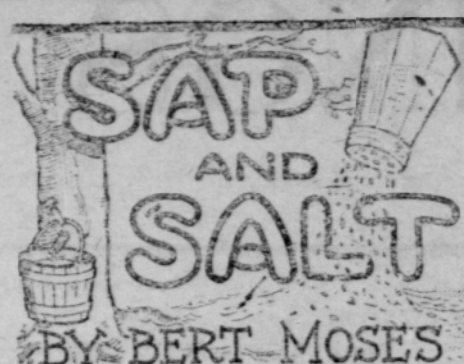

Central Pacific Financially Unable to Build K. Falls Line Says S. P. Director

WASHINGTON, Nov. 25.—The Union Pacific may not be expected to build a proposed railroad line from Klamath Falls to Susanville or Westwood Junction, if it accomplishes its purpose of acquiring the Central Pacific.

The Southern Pacific company is seeking authority from the commission to retain control of the interwoven lines of the Central Pacific, which has been an integral part of the Southern Pacific's system since 1870.

Mr. Kruttschnitt said he did not believe for a moment that the Central Pacific, as an independent and therefore financially weak road, could build the line from Klamath Falls to Westwood Junction.
