Dry Field Predicted— The weather forecast for the week includes the probability of showers along the Oregon and Washington coast, with fair weather prevailing.

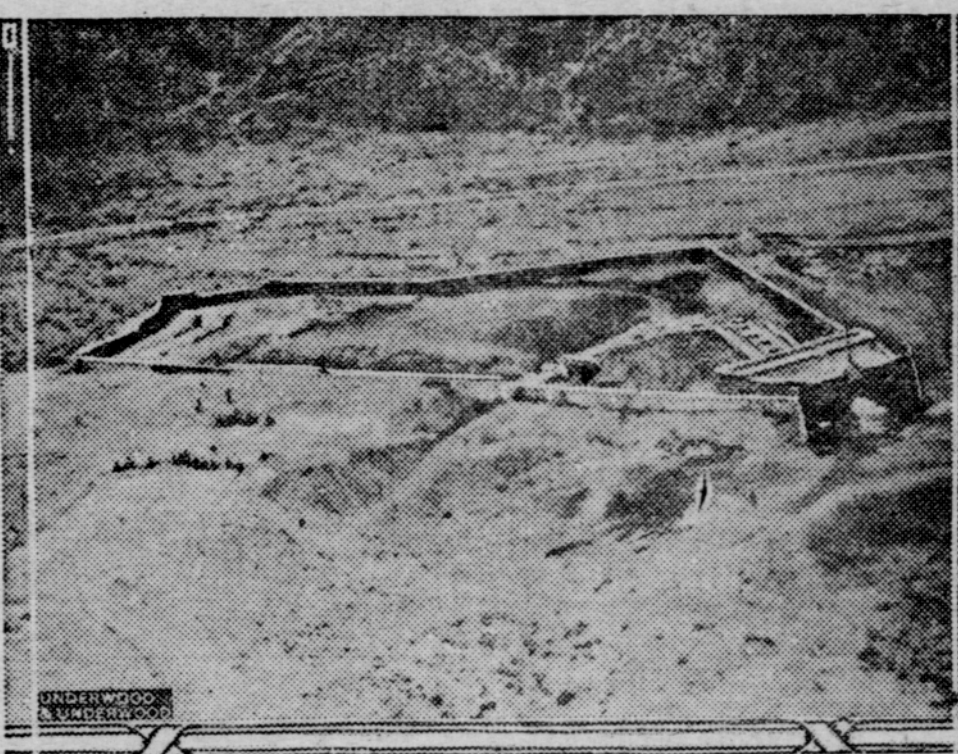
