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



was planted in 245 B. C." While it is impossible to tell the age of trees until they have been felled and their rings counted, it is quite possible, says the College, that trees as old as any that have been examined still stand in the great Sequoia forests of California, and that many of them are as old as and older than the famous Bo tree of Ceylon. The Sequola requires no props and no coddling by human hands. It reaches a height of 350 feet and a circumference of 78 feet, and has remarkable vi-

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
