

DEN OF REPTILES FOUND

THE DALLES, Or. Dec. 6 .- Highway workers on The Dalles-Dufur section of The Dalles-California highway recently dug out a mass of live rattlesnakes and grass snakes as big as a man's head, while engaged in excavation work, according to the report brought to this city by highway engineers.

The snakes were coiled about each other in a sinuous mass and were in a fissure of rock through which a small stream of water was running, it was said. They were in a semidormant state by reason of being in the process of hibernation, and the rattlers were killed without the usual excitement and danger attendant upon such a procedure.




