"We recall one instance where a celebrated engineer was preparing a set of tables for publication and was using a set of 12-place logarithms. We asked why he used 12-place tables and he replied that they were the best he could find, that he had heard there were 20-place tables but he had been unable to locate them. The interesting thing about this anecdote is that practically all the data which the celebrated engineer was tabulating had an accuracy which was seldom better than 1 per cent, and an ordinary 12inch slide rule would have been amply
