SAINT OF VIRTUE AND PIETY

St. Nicholas Was of Unblemished Character, According to Hone's "Ancient Mysteries."

ACCORDING to Hone's "Ancient Mysteries" Saint Nicholas, bishop of Myra, was a saint of great virtue and piety.

St. Nicholas is the grand patron of the children of France, to whom he brings bonbons for the good, but a cane for the naughty child.

On St. Nicholas day, December 6 the sailors of the port take the saint's image from the beautiful Church of St. Nicholas, and with a long procession of boats carry it far out to sea.

Chambers' "Book of Days" says: "Through the native rock which forms the tomb of the saint, water constantly exudes, which is collected by the canons on a sponge attached to a reed, squeezed into bottles and sold to pilgrims as a miraculous specific under the name of the 'manna of St. Nicholas.'"
