#### Right Way to Breathe.

The fundamental of health-also of Old Theory That People in Love Are beauty-is proper breathing. Most people don't bring the remote cells of the lungs into use. Reducing the respirations to ten per minute for five consecutive minutes three times a day will insure full breathing. For instance, as you are walking, instead of breathing as you ordinarily do, make ten complete respirations per minute three seconds and out for three sec onds, making a complete respiration every six seconds, at which rate your respiration will be at the rate of ten per minute. To simplify, make 50 complete respirations last you for five minutes. At the end of five minutes you will find that you will be breathing deeply and fitting your lungs to capacity. This is simply an exercise, and three or four times a day will be found sufficient, according to a De-
