## BUICK SHOW VERY GOOD IS REPORT

PORTLAND, Aug. 11.—Preliminary to the big reception and showing of new model cars to be staged today, the Howard Automobile company, Buick distributor held "open house," for invited guests, friends of the firm and newspaper representatives Tuesday night at its sales-rooms on Burnside at Thirteenth street. It was the first exhibition of 1924 model cars of the make, which are expected to attract unusual attention on "automobile row" when the public is admitted to inspect them. In every important city in the United States similar first showings of the 1924 models are being made today, the manufacturers having arranged this simultaneous display and announcement and held all distributors to it.

Visitors admitted to the show-rooms Tuesday night were chiefly interested in mechanical details of the next year's car though not unimpressed with changes of design which contribute to esthetic beauties. The showing was such in this respect as to elicit exclamations of surprise from the technical men and connoisseurs of cars.

A feature of the evening was a lecture on mechanical changes worked out in developing the numerous new models, by Dick Fen-ton, Buick service manager in Portland, who had returned only a few hours before from an extended stay at the factories.

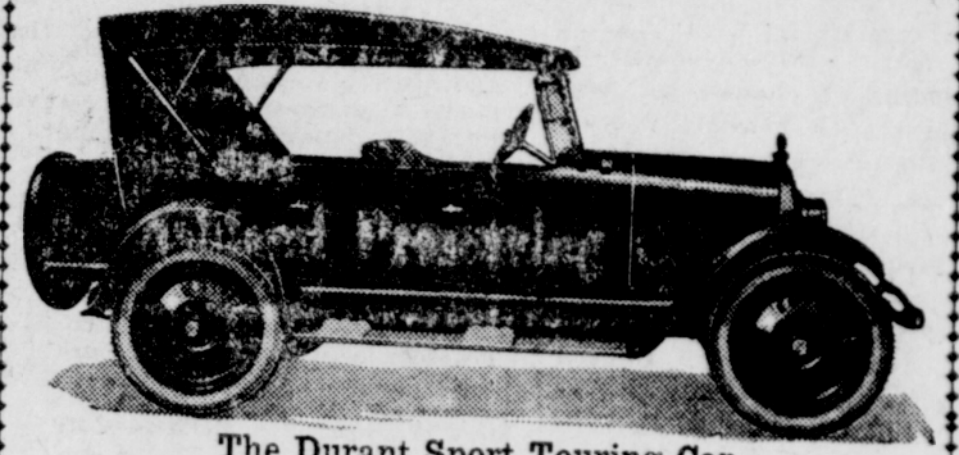
