Fires As An Index To Industrial Conditions

A "Break-Down of Morals" Shown by Fire Losses. Detroit, St. Louis, Dallas and Norfolk Are Notable Exceptions.

A NEW index of business conditions, especially in certain industries, has been discovered. When there is a marked increase in the number of fires in the establishments of a given industry, it will be found that business in that industry is in bad condition.

The obvious fact which they prove, Moral hazard is something which cannot be measured, but it must be reckoned with, and it behooves us all to work together toward suppression of this crime.

The committee is working with local authorities in all parts of the country to assist them in investigating cases of incendiarism. In a number of cities, the Police Departments have organized special arson squads.

Mr. Morgenthau ascribes the existence of moral hazard in fire insurance to the general break-down of morals in the past few years, pointing out that never before were failures from dishonesty, robberies and all sorts of crime so prevalent.
