> The Czechs had always considered the Austrians as usurpers of power. Therefore they did not recognize the right of the Hapsburg dynasty to govern them, but only submitted to force. Neither did they agree with the German students in their claim that Prague University was founded as a German school. The language is which lectures were given in those days was Latin, and the fact that Germans used to enroll there did not make it a German institution. They said that Bohemia, Moravia, and Silesia were really Czech and unjustly annexed by the hereditary foe, Austria. They proved by manifold evidence that they had their own culture and history.
