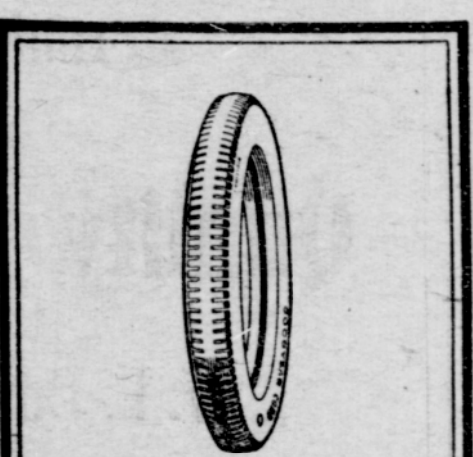

## JUDGE WATSON TELLS OF TRIP

and presto—an eden blazes forth in the desert fanned by ocean breezes and scorched by a tropic sun.

### Fields Turn to Forests

They select great areas which they advertise as oil fields, and straight-way make a pepper-box of it by setting up derricks and drilling holes to the oil regions below to a depth, sometimes of six thousand feet. If from their first well they get a "gusher," they hysterically multiply their wells which soon puts an end to the "gushing" and calls for pumping plants and seem frantically engaged in an effort to exhaust the supply, regardless of the fact that a surplus is created which local markets cannot absorb and transport facilities will not permit profitable transportation to the distant markets hungering for the product.

Their fields become forests of derricks. Often in the midst of great oases of fruit, flowers and fragrance which are transformed to unsightly things and fanned with the disgusting odors drawn from the bowels of the earth. The result is that millions of dollars are spent to store this surplus while the wells are growing weaker. Soon their available supply will be on top of the ground eating itself up with the cost of storage and insurance.

Experts are warning them continually that their methods are making their disaster. Tables are being printed showing a constant decline in the flow and an increase in the demand in market which they cannot reach. Still they drill wells and multiply pumping plants, praying for some miracle that will enable them to recoup.

There is another condition which seems to me ought to give them pause. Southern California is in the earthquake zone of the Pacific coast, and it has been unquestionably shown that the catastrophes that have resulted from shocks, and the hundreds of tremors which they annually experience are simply the result of an effort of these deeply buried strata to adjust themselves to the constant contraction of the earth.

By the constant pumping out of the oil and gas it is evident that they are contributing to the unstable conditions and inviting more frequent and more violent earthquake spasms. This, of course they do not discuss, but I firmly believe they are bringing about a great danger from this source.

**Discusses Oil Shale**  
There is another, to me, very interesting fact worthy of consideration in this connection. It is now fully demonstrated that bituminous shale is the source of all petroleum and that this shale is the result of the erosion in very ancient times of higher lands lying adjacent to the ocean or other large bodies of water. These ancient lands were heavily

forested and contained an abundant animal life which supplied the organic matter needed to furnish the fatty substance from which oil is produced. The high Sierra's, like the Siskiyou mountains are composed largely of intrusive granite which is a guarantee of that age that has furnished the richest bituminous shale. The San Bernardino mountains rise immediately to the north and northeast of these Southern California oil fields, and a casual observation will show that these great granite mountains have suffered a complete erosion of their ancient surface possessions and from them and in that early erosion came the rich bituminous shales, which by the earth's contraction and the consequent folding and wrinkling of these deep beds the pools of oil now being pumped out are supplied.

The great depth of these beds, thousands of feet below the surface prohibits mining these shales for the oil they contain. The shales now being developed near Ashland, had a like source from the Siskiyou Island, which in age was contemporaneous with the high Sierra and of the San Bernardino mountains. The reason why the Ashland shales are on the top of the ground while the Southern California shales are buried under thousands of feet of subsequent sedimentary deposit is easily explained, which I will undertake to give to you in a later interview."
