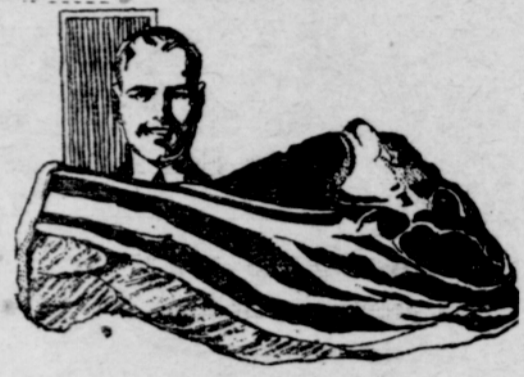

**Receipts You'll Like**

**DESSERTS THAT NOURISH**  
Now that cooler weather is here our menus must contain a greater number of calories, as it is the calories which furnish the heat that keeps our bodies at an even temperature the year round. Good, nourishing food is the only real basis for good health.

**Cocconut and Date Pudding**  
1 cup corn meal  
2 cups flour  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon baking soda  
3/4 cup sugar  
2 tablespoons melted butter  
2 cups sour milk  
1 cup fresh-keeping cocconut  
1/2 cup dates, stoned and halved.  
Mix meal, flour, salt and soda; add sugar, butter, milk, cocconut and dates. Pour into a greased mould, cover with a greased paper and steam steadily for 4 hours. Turn out and serve at once with hot milk or any sweet sauce.

**Cocconut Ambrosia**  
2 rounds chopped canned pineapple  
2 cups fresh-keeping cocconut  
1 cup chopped mixed nut meats  
4 oranges  
2 bananas  
1 cup candied cherries  
Whipped cream.  
Skin and dice the bananas and oranges. Put the ingredients in layers in a pretty glass dish. Chill and serve with whipped cream.

**MEAT COOKERY**

**Stuffed Steak**

On flank steak, one cup soft bread crumbs, one-half teaspoon salt, one half teaspoon sage, one-eighth teaspoon pepper, two tablespoons grated onion.

Mix crumbs and seasonings with one-fourth cup of melted butter or substitute. Place dressing in center of steak, roll and tie or skewer in shape. Dredge with flour, place a few strips of bacon or salt pork over the top and place in a moderately hot oven; baste several times. Serve with a brown gravy to which a few dried mushrooms have been added; or serve with a horseradish sauce.

**Pounded Round Steak**

Wipe meat with a damp cloth. Cut into portions for individual service. With a wooden potato masher pound a tablespoonful or more of flour into each portion. The pounding, breaks the tough connective tissue and the flour absorbs the juices. Cook in a hot frying pan in beef drippings.

**Breaded Veal Cutlets**

Wipe with a damp cloth. Place in a frying pan, cover with boiling water and simmer about ten minutes. Drain, dry, dip in fine bread crumbs, then in slightly beaten egg diluted with one tablespoonful of cold water; dip in crumbs again and fry in deep fat or cook in melted drippings in a heavy frying pan until brown on each side.

**REGISTRATION OF AUTOS IN STATE TO PASS 200,000 MARK**

Indications are that automobile registrations in Oregon in 1924 will easily pass the 200,000 mark, according to figures in the office of the secretary of state.

On October 31 the registration in Oregon had reached a total of 162,200, while on the corresponding date in 1922 the registration was only 131,938, as shown in a statement prepared yesterday by Sam A. Kozier, secretary of state. For the month of October this year the registration was 4692, while in October last year 3439 licenses were issued, so that the increase in October this year was 36 per cent.

Assuming that the licenses will be issued for the balance of the year at the same ratio as has prevailed up to this date," says Mr. Kozier, "there will not be less than 166,000 licensed motor vehicles in the state on December 31, 1923, which will be approximately 32,000 more cars than were licensed in the entire year

of 1922. The increase in registration in 1923 over the previous year has been unprecedented. During no one year has the total number of licenses issued but slightly exceeded 20,000 over the previous year.

"Another matter of notice is the great number of transfers. Thus far during 1923 more than 25,940 cars have been transferred to other owners after the original licenses were issued, which represents 16 per cent of the total number of cars licensed.

"The total fees for licenses and other transactions in connection with motor vehicle registration for 1923 amount to \$4,031,141. Up to October 31, 1922, these fees aggregated for that year \$3,309,551. All of this money with the exception of administrative expenses, which amount to 5 per cent of the total, is transferred, one-fourth to the counties of the state in proportion to the registration from the remaining respective counties, and the remaining three-fourths to the state highway fund, to be expended, as other moneys in that fund, for the general upkeep, extension and improvement throughout the state and in payment of the interest on outstanding bonds and for their retirement after they become due."
