'FRUIT JUICE' TURNS TO WINE; OFFICERS SAY THEY'RE PUZZLED

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 16.—Prohibition agents in Southern California have a new worry. They are now in a quandary over the home-made wine situation as the result of a Pasadena conviction which, it is held, is directly opposed to the Federal law.

Joe Le Spada, a barber, was convicted in the Pasadena police court for having in his possession 200 gallons of fruit juice which had aged beyond the legal limit. The Treasury department regulations provide that 200 gallons of fruit juice may be manufactured each year by the heads of families.

Prohibition Agent in charge of D. J. O'Leary, Rex Goodcell, collector of internal revenue, and J. C. Burke, United States attorney, are the officials who are anxious to have the situation clarified.

Le Spada, to all intent and purpose had complied with the Treasury Department regulation. He even had filed his intention of manufacturing 200 gallons of fruit juice and then nature did the rest. However, City Prosecutor Leo Riccardi, of Pasadena, convicted Le Spada of violation of the Wright Act, California's dry law. Le Spada took the stand that he did not willingly violate the law, as he did nothing to cause the grape juice to ferment.

This is just the question that is being tested out by Congressman John P. Hill, of Baltimore, Md., reports reaching here state. Hill maintains, it is said, that "the declaration of intent" issued by the Revenue Service with the sanction of the treasury department, is consistent with the Volstead act and that "nature, unaided, will make unintentional criminals" when the householder, without adding anything to grape juice, finds himself in possession of 200 gallons of claret wine.

Federal officers admit they are in a quandary.

Two other such juzzle cases now pending here are those of Pete Bradavich and Steve Brasura. Both men are said to have filed declarations of intention to make 200 gallons of grape juice, and when the agents seized them on charges of bootlegging the men are said to have had 615 gallons of home-made wine. In the fiscal year 1922-23 4,810 fruit declarations were filed by householders with the Revenue service here. Thus far this fiscal year the permits total approximately 12,000 for the Sixth District.

LOSTINE MAN HEARS WILSON OVER RADIO

Another answer to the Oregon Daily Journal's Sunday statement to the effect that no one had announced the reception of Ex-President Wilson's Armistice day speech has been received by that paper from Edwards of Lostine, Oregon. Edwards says: "I wish to state that I picked up ex-President Wilson's speech here at Lostine without the slightest difficulty. I did not use head phones but tuned in on the Magnavox and heard the speech very distinctly and quite loud; in fact, loud enough to be heard all over a large room. Of course, I was not alone on so great an event, but had visitors, who came in to hear the ex-president. They can tell you also that the address came through in fine shape.

"I use a set constructed by myself consisting of two stages radio frequency and two stages audio, the tuning being done by a single circuit. I receive the New York stations and all the large Atlantic stations regularly, have them practically every night, so the proposition of receiving the ex-president's speech did not look like a very great proposition to me."

JOLSON TELLS WHY PAPYRUS LOST RACE

Audiences have been convulsed with laughter this week over Al Jolson's newest version of the international horse race which was run at Belmont Park on October 20. Mr. Jolson is playing in his big Winter Garden triumph, "Bombo," in which he will make a tour of all the important cities and towns in the country.

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15.—Colonel Charles Forbes, former director of the Veterans' bureau, was declared to be "one of a gang of conspirators who were tied together neck and jewel to defraud the government" by Major General John O'Ryan, government counsel, in an opening statement to the senate investigating committee. O'Ryan said he would prove the truth of all charges made by Elias Mortimer, government witness, which were branded as lies by Forbes. O'Ryan said he would prove much more than Forbes' irresponsibility in the conduct of his office and lack of care of disabled soldiers.
