

This legal principle was established by the Sofia Circuit Court in a recent decision growing out of the fire in the National Theatre a year ago which caused the death of four persons and did thousands of dollars damage. Following the fire Tsankoff, the director of the theatre, and Popoff, the stage manager, were indicted on charges of criminal negligence. Tsankoff is a famous Bulgarian poet and composer, while Popoff has been known on the Bulgarian stage for forty years as a popular actor.

The court found that the fire was caused by a rustic lamp which the technical director had deemed indispensible to the performance. Inasmuch as this had nothing to do with the artistic side of the performance, with which Tsankoff and Popoff were concerned, the court decided that they were not guilty of any negligence in connection with the
