SACRAMENTO, Dec. 20 .- The new spinal fluid test of Alex Kels, Lodi slayer, agreed to last night by Warden J. J. Smith of Folsom Prison, will be made within the next few days by Dr. J. D. Ball. University of California, and a third doctor to be named by the two at a conference scheduled for this afternoon, at which time the date definitely will be fixed.
