FROCKS IN WANTED TYPES

For practical wear the season's novelties given the well-dressed woman nothing more acceptable than wool jersey and wool crepe, either of which may be used to develop the frock pictured to the left. The front is cut in square effect and stitched to a yoke with sleeves cut in one. The girl may be of self-material or of ribbon. Medium size requires 3 1/2 yards 40-inch or 1 1/2 yards 54-inch material. The bloomer dress for the little lady is made of chambray, the front and back being gathered to a yoke which is cut in one with the kimono sleeves. The upper edges of the side-closing bloomers are gathered to waistbands. If desired, a little embroidery may be added to the yoke and sleeves, or the lower edge of the skirt may be scalloped and bound with ribbon. Medium size requires 1 1/2 yards 40-inch material. LADY walks in velvet. Never has there been a season in recent years when velvet has been so popular.

It is used for suits as well as for afternoon gowns. And it is particularly smart for evening gowns. Black and white combined is the most striking arrangement. The sketch above shows two models in this. The sketch of the pure white velvet, and a skirt of the black with a striped insert of the white velvet. This band is slanted up toward the left hip, and narrows somewhat as it rises. A low waistline is bordered in a Japanese roll

of the black velvet. The dress is complete in itself and calls for no other materials to be used as trimming. It is a dignified type of gown, long lined and trained, and it is particularly fetching with the rather gamine short-haired bob. The black and white velvet dress in the center is an unbelted model, brodered in jet beads in solid masses. The neckline is oval and quite plain. There is a border of the white velvet at the bottom, about two inches in width. With this dress a tight necklace of crystal should be worn, together with a long necklace of jet. The sketch of the dress to the left shows a model in the new and beautifully printed velvet. These printed velvets have a soft look that is very flattering; the colorings are hazy and delicate. The gown above is in pastel orchids and blue, and has a drop of deep brown that looks very hand-

some with the borders of brown skunk. A truly original color combination, and one that is entirely new. The photo shows Mary Astor, the Paramount player, wearing a gown of plain silk velvet, another one of the popular velvets. Her gown is tight fitting, with the soft rumpled waistline and floating panels from the shoulders. She chose this lovely model to wear in "Woman Proof," her newest picture, in which she appears with Thomas Meighan. It is in deep China blue, and absolutely without trimming.
