OREGON—IN COMPARISON

The lives of those lost in the volcanic infested regions of the Mediterranean totals many hundred thousands. A year does not pass but that some town and many of its inhabitants are ushered into eternity by their mountains vomiting from their bowels molten lava and rock.

In the Middle West of our own United States the toll of cyclones, floods, and bitter cold is appalling. Comparatively speaking, they contend with the two extremes of weather. They suffer a biting, penetrating cold in winter, and swelter in the oppressing heat of summer.

Not many years ago the nation, yea the universe, was appalled when the wires flashed to an otherwise peaceful world that a terrific earthquake had rent the streets of San Francisco, toppled from their foundations the modern brick and concrete structures, and that a fire was gutting the city of its business blocks and homes.

But with all the pleasures of a vineyard in sunny Italy, with all the lure of wealth held by an Oklahoma or Kansas corn field, and the lure of gold and perpetual summer of southern California, why does humanity continue to plod on and on, laying foundations for the future and posterity in sections less favored than many others in this old world?

It is only a matter of a few years until the rush of humanity will turn this way. The innumerable advantages of Oregon can no longer go unclaimed.

THE LITIGATED DRESS PATTERN

Dress patterns have an important place in modern life. In 1922 they got before the Supreme Court of the United States in a suit through which a pattern company tried to enforce its contract with a retailer.

In August 1923, the Federal Trade Commission followed up this court decision with an order which directed an important group of pattern manufacturers to cease and desist from entering into contracts with retailers binding the retailers to maintain an indicated resale price and to refrain from selling competing patterns.

FARMERS' AND WORKERS' DOLLAR DEPRECIATED

Wage-workers are being paid for their labor and farmers are receiving for their produce a dollar that is

worth but 60 1-2 cents, compared with 1914, according to the National Industrial Conference Board, an organization representing large employers. This depreciation of the dollar is revealed in a survey made by the experts of the Board.

The American people bought their winter clothing, fuel, light, shelter and other necessities and the gifts they gave for Christmas at prices which were the highest that have prevailed since May, 1921, the Conference Board reports.

Wholesale prices of agricultural products were about 4 3-10 per cent higher in October of 1923 than in the same month of 1922, according to the Department of Labor. But the wholesale prices of foods was 5 6-10 per cent, the price of cloths and clothing 5 8-10 per cent, and of house furnishings 4 per cent higher than in October, 1922.

COULD HENRY FORD ISSUE HIS OWN MONEY?

Before the Civil War in the United States anybody who organized a state bank could issue notes—promises to pay money—their circulation outside the community in which the bank was located depended upon the reputation of the bank.

The recent decision of the Supreme Court of the United States in the child labor law case, holding that a law imposing a tax for regulatory or prohibitive purposes, and not primarily as a means of raising revenue, was unconstitutional, clearly reversed its former decision sustaining the prohibitive tax on state bank notes, which no one pretended was a revenue measure.
