SPONGE CAKE

5 eggs
1 cup flour
1 cup sugar
1/4 ts. salt
3 tb. lemon juice
Grated rind of 1/2 lemon
Sift the flour once before measuring. Beat the egg yolks until they are stiff. Add the sugar, the salt, and the lemon juice and rind. Mix thoroughly. Fold in the flour and then the egg whites which have been beaten until they are stiff. Bake in an ungreased tube pan 50 to 60 minutes in a slow oven (325 deg. F.)

TOMATO RABBIT

1 lb cheese, grated
1/2 cup canned tomatoes strained
Salt, pepper and mustard
1/2 tsp. soda
1/2 cup milk
1/2 cup flour
1/2 cup butter

Mix the butter and flour thoroughly in a sauce pan over the fire. Add the milk slowly, stirring constantly. When this starts to thicken, add the tomato juice and soda which have been stirred together. Cook about two minutes. Set in a pan of boiling water and add the cheese cut in small pieces and the seasoning. As soon as the cheese is melted, the rabbit is ready to serve. Over-cooking makes the cheese tough and stringy. Serve on hot buttered toast.

BRAN BREAD

2 cups bread flour
2 cups bran
6 tb. sugar
4 1/2 ts. baking powder
1 1/2 ts. salt
1 1/2 cup milk
1 egg
1 tb. shortening
(All measurements are level. Sift the flour once before measuring.)

them slowly to the dry ingredients. Add the melted shortening last. Bake in a well greased bread pan, in a moderate oven (375 deg. F.) about 1 hour.

One-half cup of nuts and one-half cup of raisins may be added if desired.

If sour milk is used, substitute 3/4 ts. soda and 1 1/2 ts. baking powder for the 4 1/2 ts. baking powder.

BRAN MUFFINS

2 cups bread flour
2 cups bran
2 cups sour milk
1 egg
1/2 cup sugar
1 teaspoon soda
1 teaspoon baking powder
2 teaspoons salt
1 t tablespoon shortening
(All measurements are level. Sift the flour once before measuring.)

Mix and sift the dry ingredients except the bran. Add the bran and mix thoroughly. Mix the milk and the beaten egg and add them slowly to the dry ingredients. Add the melted shortening last. Bake 25 to 30 minutes in a hot oven (400 deg. F.)

If sweet milk is used instead of sour milk, omit the soda and use five teaspoons of baking powder instead of one.

This makes about 15 medium sized muffins.

DOUGHNUTS
4 cups bread flour or 4 1/2 cups pastry flour
2 tsp. salt
5 tsp. baking powder
1/2 tsp. nutmeg
1/4 tsp. cinnamon
1 cup sugar
2 tsp. shortening
2 eggs
1 cup sweet milk
(If sour milk is used add 1/2 tsp. soda and use only 3 tsp. of baking powder. Sift the soda with the other dry ingredients.)
All measurements are level. Sift the flour once before measuring. Cream the shortening and sugar together, add the beaten eggs and then the milk alternately with the dry ingredients which have been mixed and sifted. Roll out lightly on a board to about 1/4 inch thickness. Cut with a doughnut cutter, fry in deep fat (374 degrees F.) The fat should be hot enough to make the doughnuts rise instantly to the top.
