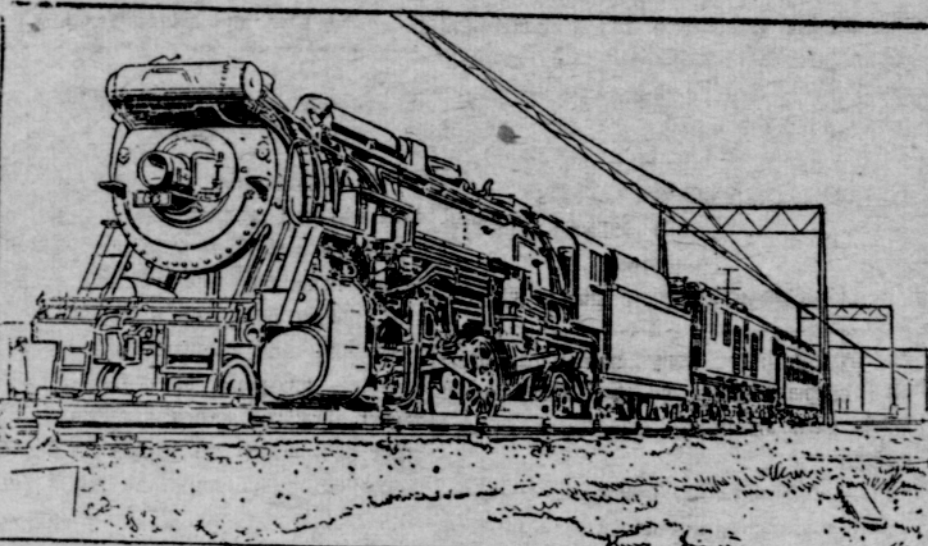

Electric Locomotive Is Victor in Tug-o'-War

Two monsters of the rails, one operated by electricity, or "white coal," and the other by steam, staged a spectacular tug-o-war at Erie, Pa., recently before railway officials from all parts of the country. Puffing and snorting, with its huge driving wheels turning ahead, the steam locomotive was

pulled backward, despite its utmost efforts to hold its own. Both engines were of the same weight. The steamer is one of ten built for service in Mexico, where it will haul freight over grades that in some instances are twice as steep as those usually found in the United States.

Men Outnumbered by Women in Census of World

That there are more women than men in the world, is the conclusion drawn by a statistician after recent researches. Among the 475,000,000 inhabitants of the earth, there are 250,000,000 women, 25,000,000 more than the number of men, his figures show. In Germany there are 1,026 women to each 1,000 men; in Russia, 1,400 women to each 1,000 men, and in France and Belgium, respectively, 1,093 and 1,033 for each 1,000 men. The 1920 census reports for the United States show that there are 1,040 males to every 1,000 females in this country. The preponderance of women in foreign lands is believed to be partly explained by the death toll of numerous wars in the past few generations.

FARMER-LABOR PARTY FORMED IN PORTLAND

Chairman and Executive Committee Named; to Join With National Party.

PORTLAND, March 5.—A group of active workers in the Farmer-Labor movement held a meeting here March 1st and formally launched the Farmer-Labor party in Oregon with Otto Newman state chairman, Franklin L. Rusmisi Secretary-Treasurer, A. L. Karnopp, Vice-chairman and state organizer.

The state executive committee was elected as follows: Otto Newman, Franklin L. Rusmisi, A. L. Karnopp and P. L. Turner. Temporary headquarters have been opened at 455 Alder Street and active work of organizing the state will commence immediately.

It is the intention of this organization to work in conjunction with the National Farmer-Labor party which has called a convention in St. Paul for May 20th. The presidential nominee of the National Farmer-Labor party will in all probability be Robert M. La Follette or some other one of the progressive congressmen.

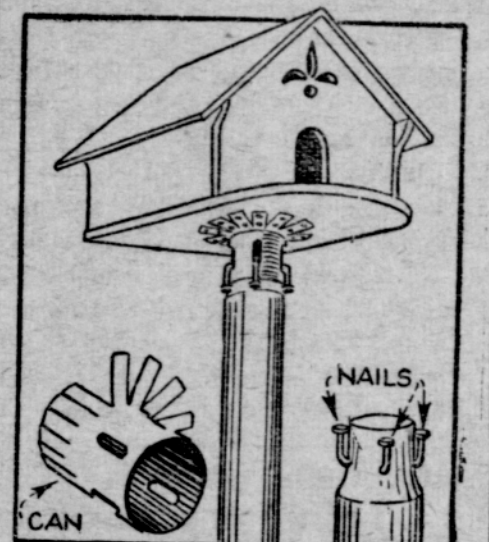
WOMAN, 97, RESCUED FROM BURNING ROOM

HOOD RIVER, March 4.—When the home of J. H. Jeffrey, director of the Apple Growers' association, burned today, Mrs. Jeffrey carried her 97-year-old invalid mother, Mrs. Nancy Slonaker, from a burning second-story room. Her husband met her at the head of the stairs and the aged woman, who was bedridden, was removed safely from the building.

Neighbors saved all household furniture, except from two upper story bedrooms. The loss, estimated at approximately \$5000, was covered by insurance.

Detachable Bird Houses

It is becoming quite the fashion for country, suburban, and even city dwellers to provide small bird houses in yards and parks. They are usually mounted on poles or in trees, and they are securely fastened, it is not an easy matter to remove them when it is desired to paint, repair, or clean them, which is occasionally necessary. A method of mounting a bird house so that it can readily be detached is shown in the drawing. The top of the supporting post is trimmed down to fit loosely inside a No. 2 fruit can, which is cut and slotted as shown. The can is nailed to the underside of the bird house and slipped over the end of the pole. Nails are then driven into the slots and bent downward at right angles as shown, so that the can will not slip off. When removing the bird house the nails are turned to the position shown in the lower detail, when the can may easily be released, by an upward pull.

"Soap Holes" of Cowboy Days Become Valuable Clay

"Soap holes," once thought by cattle ranchers of the West to be dangerous mires of worthless slime, have become mines of mineral clay of great commercial value. Bentonite, as the substance taken from the deposits is called, has been made into an ingredient to give body and weight to paper and to aid in the mixing of wall plaster and pastes. Soap makers experimenting with it are said to have found it possessed of good cleaning qualities and beneficial to the skin. Many of the clays and massage creams used by beauty parlors are mixed with it as a base. In the raw state it lies near the surface. It absorbs almost seven times its volume of water, it forms a soft, slippery mass where the deposits are in low ground.

ACTION AFFECTING SIEZT DEFERRED UNTIL MARCH 11

SPOKANE, Wash., March 5.—No further action is expected in the case of Maurice W. Sietz, Portland attorney, and George Gillispie, Portland bond dealer, until the federal grand jury reconvenes here March 11. The case arose out of charges and counter charges made in a foreclosure suit here last week.

United States Attorney Sylvester Garvin was instructed by the court to investigate Gillispie's statement on the stand that Sietz prepared an affidavit without his knowledge and that his signature is a forgery.

Before Garvin could complete the work, Sietz charged that Gillispie had committed perjury on the stand and had endeavored to blackmail him. The court then ordered the grand jury to reconvene to probe the charges fully.
