THE PARK BOND VICTORY

The victory of the park bond issue at the special city election Wednesday is the cause for gratification among a very large majority of the citizens of Ashland and reflects a condition that is commendable.

The approval of the bond issue by a vote of nearly three to one reveals a united citizenry. It indicates, unmistakably, a unity of purpose and all but a unanimity of opinion on public questions and improvements that are of vital interest to the city and its future.

A pleasing feature in connection with the decision rendered by the voters is that it is a splendid recognition of the value of the auto camp as a municipal and community asset. It is a recognition of the future value of the camp ground to the city from an advertising standpoint and as source of business for the various firms of Ashland.

The result indicates a full realization of Ashland's importance and possibilities as a tourist center, and opens the way whereby Lithia park and the auto camp will become preeminent among tourist auto camps of the nation. This statement is made without reservation or fear of contradiction. The unsurpassed location of the park and camp, the beauty of the surroundings, their close proximity to the city, all combine to lend comfort and charm to the camp, which with present equipment and that to be provided by the bond issue will, without question, make it the unexcelled auto camp of America.

The effect of the extensive improvements to be made to the camp will not be local. It will extend to every district in Oregon and will exert a most favorable influence over tourists who will pour into the state during this and succeeding years. It is a recognized fact that Ashland is and will continue to be one of the principal gateways to the state, and it requires no stretch of imagination to realize that the impressions tourists receive as they come into Oregon from the south and drive into the beautiful park and modernly equipped camp ground and find a haven of rest and comfort that their first impressions of Oregon will be favorable. The impressions afforded by the camp will continue with them throughout their tour of the whole state, hence the importance of the bond issue extends far beyond local borders.

As stated editorially by the Tidings a few days ago, the bond issue victory is a step forward. It places Ashland in a position to grow and advance in that we are fostering an asset that is of inestimable value. The victory is heralded to the four directions that Ashland is composed of public spirited and aggressive citizens who are ready to join with the other districts of Oregon in bringing to the state the greatest era of development that has ever been our lot.

M'LEAN A DISGRACE TO THE PROFESSION

The spectacle of Edward McLean, publisher of the Washington Post, admitting before the senate committee investigating the oil scandal, that his only connection with the disgraceful affair was to follow the suggestion of Ex-Secretary Fall and announce that he loaned Fall \$100,000, because the latter was being placed in an uncomfortable position, is most damaging to the American press. His admission was a plea of guilty to being an unadulterated liar, and participation in an act that was framed to hide from public view the stealing of the nation's resources by a coterie of unprincipled jackals, whose patriotism is made subservient to the greed for gold. McLean is no less guilty than Fall. Fall attempted to sell out his government and McLean tried to shield him in the transaction. McLean framed a damnable lie to hide a misfit and crook who would loot and pilfer of the few remaining resources of the nation, and in so doing he revealed himself as unfit to be called an American as the reddest red or the most radical I. W. W.

We are now engaged in a controversy over tightening the immigration laws to keep out undesirables and those who can not become honest and loyal citizens. We want none of the agitators, and have no room for those who come here with the intention of maintaining allegiance to the lands from whence they came. We are beginning to offer opportunities for the desirable foreigner to become an American citizen in fact as well as in name. We have initiated the work of Americanizing those who are classified as immigrants, and in this the influence of the American newspaper plays an important role. The newspaper is presumed to be one of the guide-posts for public opinion. If it is pure at heart it is both an inspiration for and a teacher of the principles of liberty. Imagine the results if all American newspapers of prominence were guided by such as McLean. The condition would result disastrous-

ly to foreigners not only, but would betray the most sincere Americans, destroy liberty and bring anarchy and chaos.

The Washington Post, backed by unlimited wealth, and possessing a tremendous influence, is published in the heart of the nation, which should be the source of inspirations for devoted loyalty and permanent patriotism. Instead, our beautiful capitol, is made the seat of operations for such as McLean. Thus we see one of the influential newspapers of the nation in its true light. We see it as an influence for greed and for wealth. We behold its guiding hand as a force that knows no limit in encouraging and protecting graft, corruption and the looting of public resources.

The charge is frequently made that the American press is subsidized and that its soul is not its own, and the bringing to light of a few more McLeans will prove the truth of the accusation. McLean, confessed liar and conspirator against his government, is a disgrace to the newspaper profession.

CARELESS WORKMEN COSTLY

A young man carrying his arm in a sling applied to the manager of a machine shop for a job. The talk turned to the nature of his injury and the young man mentioned a number of other accidents that had befallen him. He had suffered a fractured arm four times, once nearly lost his eyesight and had gone through innumerable escapes. There was a touch of pride in his voice as he narrated these things. He evidently felt himself a bit of a hero. But he didn't get the job he sought.

"I wouldn't dare have him around," the machine-shop manager told me afterwards. "He's evidently careless or he wouldn't have had so many more accidents than an average person's share. We can't avoid all accidents, but this fellow was evidently born without a large sense of caution. He is probably just as careless in his statements as he is about his body. Sooner or later he might get into trouble here, blame us for it, and then sue for damages."—Fred Kelly in "The Nation's Business."

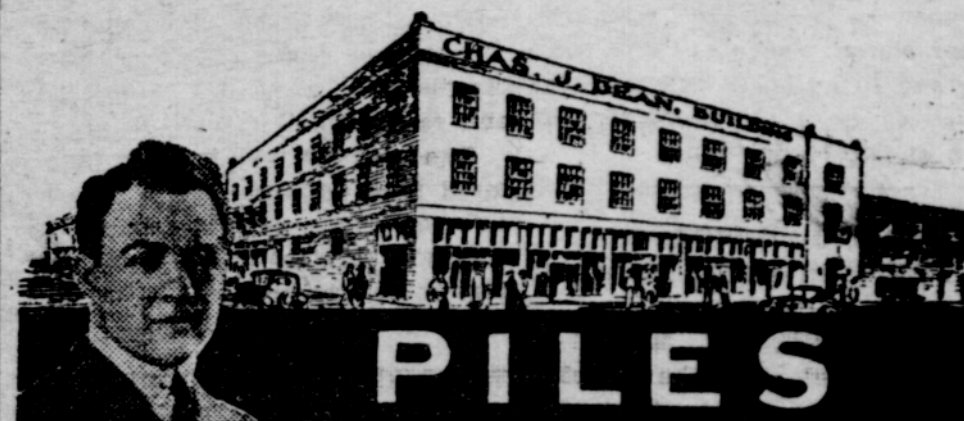
