Y GIRLS TO MEET IN NEW YORK APRIL 30

Women's Role in Affairs of World to Be Kynote in International Meet

STRESS FELLOWSHIP

Foreign Notables Expected to Lend World-Wide Aspect to Large Gathering

NEW YORK, April 15.—Women's role in world peace and kindred projects will be discussed at length when 2,500 delegates assemble in this city during the week of April 30 to May 6 for the Eighth National Biennial convention of the Young Women's Christian Association.

Virtually every class, age and profession of American women will be represented, from the girl behind the factory machine to the college student, and from women of leisure to those from the most remote farms and rural sections.

Mrs. Frederick W. Pa'st, of Philadelphia, will preside.

The keynote of the convention will be fellowship between the women of all nations, which it is the association's aim to establish, and one of the interesting features of the week will be an international dinner, at which there will be present at least eighty-three women from foreign countries. Among the foreign guests expected, many of whom will later attend the meeting of the World's Committee of the Y. W. C. A. in Washington, are the Hon. Mrs. Montague Waldegrave, president of the World's Y. W. C. A.; Viscountess Gladstone and Miss Charlotte Niven, all of Great Britain; Miss Iris Wingate, of India; and two graduates of American colleges—Mrs. T. C. Chu and Mrs. H. C. Mei, of China, respectively.

In addition to the international aspect of the convention, an interesting feature will be the gathering of the young women of the country in three assemblies—one of students, one of business girls and one of girls in industry.

After a series of meetings paralleling the sessions of the convention proper they will appear before the delegates to explain the needs and desires of their individual groups and to suggest plans for the association program for the ensuing two years. Miss Helen Gwynn, of Indianapolis, will preside over the Industrial Assembly, and Miss Bertha E. Pa'st, a young lawyer in the employ of the Department of the Interior at Washington, will be chairman of the Business Assembly.

SEN. McNARY FILES FOR RENOMINATION

"Tax Reduction, Farm Relief, Law Enforcement, Oregon Development" His Slogan

SALEM, April 11.—With "tax reduction, farm relief, law enforcement, and Oregon development" as his campaign slogan, United States Senator Charles L. McNary today filed with the secretary of state his declaration of candidacy for renomination in the May Republican primary.

Senator McNary is completing his seventh year in the senate, and during his term of office has accomplished much for Oregon. In fact United States Senator George H. Moses, Republican leader in the senate from New Hampshire, declares that Senator McNary "has accomplished more during his tenure in office than any western senator."

Since Senator McNary entered the senate Oregon has received appropriations from the government totalling the giant sum of \$30,789,819.

LLOYD GEORGE MAY LEAD CAMPAIGN

Ex-Premier Said to Favor Modified Prohibition for Great Britain

LONDON, April 14.—That Lloyd George is likely to lead a great prohibition campaign in the near future is the confident belief of his intimate friends.

It seems that the idea has been smoldering for some months in the agile brain of the ex-Premier—ever since his tour of the United States. At present he does not contemplate the possibility of complete prohibition in Britain. But he foresees the possibility of great restrictions whereby the present national drink bill of five million dollars daily will be cut down to a minimum.

His views on the question were made strikingly clear in the recent debate in the House of Commons on the Welsh Local Option bill. He then described his American tour and paid a wonderful tribute to the already evident effects and benefits of prohibition. He said he had not allowed himself to be deluded or blinded by the flagrant breaches of the law to be seen every day in New York and the other big cities. And he declared that he had seen in the Middle West a law-abiding, happy, contented people, who in the next generation will have completely lost the desire or the taste for drink.

Lloyd George went on to declare that prohibition has come to stay; that the women of the United States are solidly behind the movement, and that prohibition means increased industrial efficiency and a more thrifty and industrious working class.

This attitude toward prohibition is no new thing on the part of Lloyd George. He has inherited much of the dislike of the average

age Welsh Free Churchman to drink in any form. And although he is not a teetotaler himself he has absolute horror of the liquor trade as it exists in England.

From the political viewpoint, which never leaves his mind, such a campaign would have enormous advantages. He would carry with him the majority of his own party, the whole of the Labor party and the great section of the Tories which is represented by Lady Astor. His opponents would be the extreme Tories and the brewing interests. And he is shrewd enough to know that the most of the nine million women voters of Britain would be supporting him.

Another factor weighing with him is that he believes a successful anti-liquor campaign might be made the key of a great scheme of social reform. He thinks that the housing and unemployment problems in Britain might, to a large extent, be almost automatically solved by the saving of the money now spent on drink. And at the back of his mind there is the con-

viction that a successful social campaign of the kind might restore him to office and power.
