REPORT IS FILED BY COUNTY NURSE

Activities Are Listed and Include Numerous Visits in Districts of County.

The following is taken from the report of Margaret Deveraux, county nurse, and should prove interesting to readers of the Tidings:

22 nursing visits.
185 instructive and investigative visits.
169 miscellaneous visits.

These visits may also be classified as:

96 general.
34 tuberculosis
122 child welfare,
17 prenatal
3 maternity
40 social service
64 miscellaneous.
Total—376.

There have been 126 new patients and \$9 discharged, leaving 37 patients on hand. However, 8 patients have been sent to the State Institutions. Most of the arrangements for four of these patients have been made by other agencies.

Tuberculosis Nursing

As the Jackson County Public Health Association is a branch of the Oregon Tuberculosis Association, we take special interest in the welfare of tuberculosis patients and in preventing tuberculosis, to make our anti-tuberculosis program more effective and inclusive, and in case patients were not reported who might have been while there was no nurse, a tuberculosis survey will be put on this spring, to be directed by Miss Holmes, from the Bureau of Surveys of the Oregon Tuberculosis Association. Dr. Bellinger, of the State Tuberculosis Sanitarium is to hold a chest clinic at the end of the survey, admission to which will be free. His survey has the approval of the County Medical Society, in fact, it is they who have invited Dr. Bellinger to hold the clinic. All dental work will be cared for by the Jackson County Public Health Association.

Other Preventive Tuberculosis Work—School Nursing.

Because we are so interested in preventing the development and spread of tuberculosis, the nurse spends a large share of her time in the schools, and in holding infant and children's clinics. Children more easily contract tuberculosis than adults, so they are inspected yearly for symptoms of this disease, and are encouraged to form good health habits and have any remedial defect found corrected, for a well developed health child can withstand the germs of tuberculosis much better than a sickly child.

62 visits to 45 different schools have been made since the latter part of August. 1,171 children have been inspected, not defective \$86, or about 68 per cent defective. 256 corrections have been made since the nurses last visit. Many of the defects might be corrected if the children had a way of getting to town. We are badly in need of tonsil and dental clinics. here are 223 cases of defective tonsils and 413 cases of defective teeth.

198 pupils were inspected for communicable disease and 72 excluded for the usual skin diseases, measles, scarlet fever, and diphtheria. In the spring, toxin anti-toxin is to be given to the two districts which have had diphtheria, and of course, will be given to any other districts desiring it. 90 visits have been made to school

children's homes and 803 written notices sent to parents regarding the Home Demonstration Agent thanks being due to Miss Teich. have been weighed and measured, for the use of her scales. Miss Teich assisted in the weighing and advising of a number of these children, also. 112 of these children were found seriously underweight. Districts were found either surprisingly healthy or else in such a mal-nourished condition that it was enough to haunt one. However, there is always a reason for such conditions, and hot school lunches, improved food and health habits, are working wonders with these children. Moreover, if the teachers and the parents would not cooperate with the nurse and the child, little could be done. Generally speaking, people in Jackson County take unusual pride in good health and accept in good spirit suggestions for any improvements. It is wished that more of our larger schools had scales. A special weighing and measuring program may be put on in the lower grades of the Central Point School, this school being the proud possessor of a good set of scales. All children weighed are encouraged to keep a subsequent record of their weight.

Infant and Pre-School

School inspections have disclosed the fact that many children

must lose time after beginning school to have defects corrected, which might have been better attended to before ever entering school. To better emphasize this idea, 13 diagnostic infant, pre-school, and school clinics have been held with a total attendance of 295. Dr. William W. P. Holt was usually the doctor in attendance. Dr. Estella Ford Warner, Shephard-Towner Representative for Oregon, held five clinics in October with a total attendance of 108. In all these clinics only a diagnosis is made of conditions found. The baby is weighed and measured; the right kind of feedings suggested and any condition requiring medical supervision is referred to the family doctor. If all these parents who needed this supervision, believed it was necessary enough to pay for it or could pay for it, then we would have finished our obligations towards these patients. As it is, many of these mothers are not sufficiently convinced by one visit to our clinic of the need of making checking-up visits to the doctor, nor can many afford it. It is therefore wished that clinics with a doctor might be held monthly, not only for the purpose of diagnosis but that of supervision.

LARGE CREW WORKS ON SHASTA ROAD

Four Steam Shovels and 150 Men Employed; Cars Await Gates Each Day.

BAIRD, Calif., April 18. —The Nevada Contracting Company, which is widening the state highway on curves between Bayha and Half-Way Creek and rebuilding portions so as to shorten the distance, has 150 men employed and four steam shovels at work. Five camps are maintained. The contract calls for the removal of 400,000 cubic yards of earth. The job is about 15 per cent completed, as nearly as can be estimated. Two shifts are employed. The first crew of men goes to work at 7 o'clock in the evening and works until 3 o'clock the next morning, when the second eight-hour shift comes on.

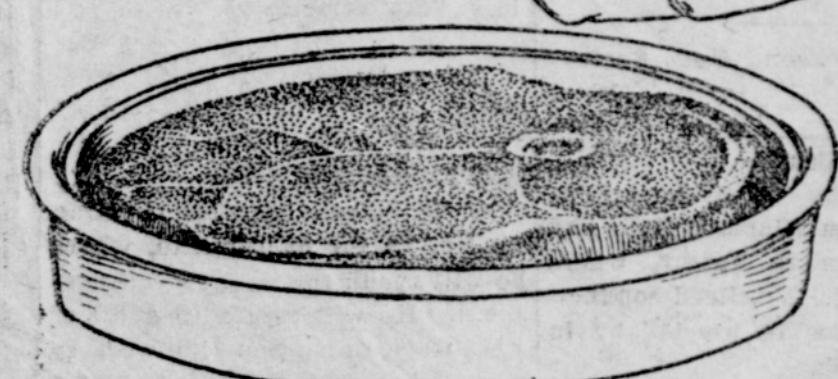
caught between the gates are allowed to pass out.
