FOLKS AND FIRES

With the approach of the summer fire season, the perennial question of "campers" fires will again come up. It has been the general theory that the more campers the more fires will occur. This is not always the case. The per cent of fires with reference to human use usually increases up to a certain point and then very rapidly decreases. Otherwise there would be no forests at all near large centers of population like New York, Philadelphia, and parts of New England, or in European countries, where the population is extremely dense. Where the use of a forest by recreationists and other increases beyond a certain point, their care with such fire increases and the same attitude of mind concerning fires exists as in towns or city parks.

The city parks are the most used spots to be found anywhere, yet fires are very rare, although there is a great deal of trash and combustible material found in them. This is because it is everybody's recognized duty to put out such fires. A similar attitude will in time be created on the portions of the National Forests where human use is extensive. Public sentiment in such localities will not permit a fire to do much damage but will immediately take steps to put it out. The transition of fire risk from high to low exists somewhere beyond the pioneering stage of little use and the point of much use by large numbers. This gap can be greatly narrowed by proper education. The aim of fire prevention education is to make the forest-using American public "fire-conscious."

WHO IS THE MERCHANT?

The home merchant—Who is he? He is the chap who gives you credit when you are financially broke, and carries your account until you are able to pay.

He is the chap who gives you back your money or makes exchanges when you are not satisfied with what you have bought.

He is the chap who meets you at the door with a handshake, and lets out with a message to the "kids" and a real "come again, goodbye."

He is the chap whose clerks live in the home town and spend their money with you and other local people.

He is the chap whose clerks live in the home town charitable organizations, and talks for the home town and boosts for it every year.

He is the chap who helps supply our churches and sends flowers to your family when you die, and follows your body out among the trees and tombs, as far as human feet may travel with the dead.

He is the home merchant—your neighbor—your helper in time of need.

Don't you think you ought to trade with him, and be his friend and his helper in time of need?

Don't you know that every dollar you spend out of town for merchandise is sent to strangers—to men who never spend a dollar here? You don't save much, frequently nothing, when you send your money out of town. And don't you know that the growth and prosperity of this city depends very largely upon the success and prosperity of the home merchant? Out of town people judge our city by the appearance of our stores and the degree of enterprise shown by our merchants. And our home merchants cannot succeed unless home folks give them loyal support.

ASHLAND IS PRAISED

Ashland citizens demonstrate the degree in which they value an auto camp when they vote three-to-one for a \$10,000 bond issue to provide funds to construct a rustic community house at the camp, install a laundry, a dozen additional showers and modern sanitation so that 150 cars may be accommodated daily. During the first twenty-five days in March, 713 out-of-state automobiles registered at Ashland, and it is doubtful if half of the cars entering through this southern gate-way registered at this point. No wonder that Ashland merchants claim, with full justification, that half of their business during the five summer months of last year came from the tourist. And, furthermore they credit the auto camp with producing one-half of the increase in their permanent population during 1923. They make it interesting for the automobilist to remain in Ashland.—Oregon Business.

ASHLAND SAYS "NO"

Ashland voters on Friday last, failed to sanction the proposed new charter which would have given the city a commission form of government. Klamath Falls citizens, in a way regret the outcome inasmuch as many here

would have been interested in ascertaining the efficacy of the altered plan of municipal administration. From those who are familiar with affairs in the neighboring city it is given as an opinion that a proposal to adopt a city manager form would possibly have met with wider acceptance. The framers of the lost charter, however, are said to have felt that the commission idea was more desirable. Be that as it may Ashland will continue to meet its problems as in the past and Klamath Falls will probably be forced to sit by until some other community nearby essays to depart from established customs.—Klamath Falls Herald.

PREACHER PROVES MOONSHINE POISON

COLORADO SPRINGS, Colo., April 23—Rev. W. G. Schaeffer, pastor of the United Brethren Church here, is giving a series of lectures against illegal liquor, accompanying them with intensive demonstrations of the physical dangers that lurk in the new-made "moon."

Several hundred members of his congregation were allowed to see and smell moonshine stills confiscated by officers, and also were permitted to sniff the finished product.

The exhibits, placed upon a platform in the church, included evil-smelling stills made out of old milk cans, with a scum of fusel oil on the bottom and decayed material clinging to the sides, and vial samples of the "hooch" as it is presented for sale.

Rev. Schaeffer declared, after his first lecture and demonstration that it probably was one of the most successful services ever held in his church.

"I believe there were many skeptics with the idea that moonshine might be all right, if they wanted to drink it," he said, "but they were apparently immediately converted to the belief that it is and always will be the rankest kind of poison."
