UNSUNG HEROES

Has loyalty become such a rare trait among humans as to be commonly mistaken for heroism? When the wireless operator on board ship, whose business it is to flash the S. O. S., sticks to his post though the ship is sinking the world is prone to call him a hero, but on the records of his employers he will henceforth be known as a loyal worker. The crossing watchman risks his life to save that of a child, who has strayed on the tracks of the fast express train, and the newspaper headlines blaze forth the inspiring word "hero". His employers will cite him for loyalty to his duty as a crossing watchman. Wars may be chronicled in acts of heroism, but the heroes are soldiers who have only obeyed the call of duty, of loyalty to their country. It would seem that the loyal soldiers of commerce, industry and war are the heroes.

But there are deeds of loyalty performed in the more humdrum course of daily life which are never recorded in the public press, which do not attract Carnegie medals, which do not bestow upon their executors the title of hero. Is there loyalty any greater than that of a workman to his employer, of a citizen to his country? Look about you and feel refreshed with the meagerness of the disloyal. Men barren of loyalty are sure to be friendless. Is there in the world a greater virtue than fidelity to self and society?

Loyalty is the cement which binds together, makes the wheels of industry go round, drives the ships and railroads of world commerce and secures the family, community and society against chaos and destruction. All mankind loves a loyal dog. How much more essential is loyalty in a human being?

It is probable that the dead leader of Tammany Hall had many personal virtues. He could not otherwise have exercised the power and held sway so long in a government within a government.

There must be some virtue in the Tammany organization, or it could not have survived so many decades and controlled so constantly the plans and political life of the greatest city in the world.

But the Murphy type and the Murphy system were not the type that should be in control or the system that should exercise power. The Murphy idea of government was not government of, by and for the people, but a government suited to the purposes and plans of Tammany Hall.

The Murphy purpose was a cross-current to the purpose of most of the people outside the city limits of New York. The Murphy ideal took no account of the farmer out in Dakotas. It was not in harmony with the aspirations of the stockmen or fruit growers on the Pacific coast.

His notion was group government, with his particular group exercising power far beyond its legitimate

rights. It has a huge representation in congress, and it is a representation that has no understanding of the needs and thoughts of the millions living west of the Allegheny mountains. Its liaison is with similar groups in Philadelphia, Boston and other great cities where the soil that is the sustaining force in all American life is not known or cared about.

Few men rise out of their immediate environment. Provincialism is one of the besetting sins of human society. A regrettable factor in human affairs is that so many refuse or neglect to see the viewpoint of others and to have enough concern in the common welfare.

By that token, it is possible to be generous in the appraisal of the Murphys, their lieutenants and their cohorts. But it is not a good thing to let them run the United States.—Oregon Daily Journal.

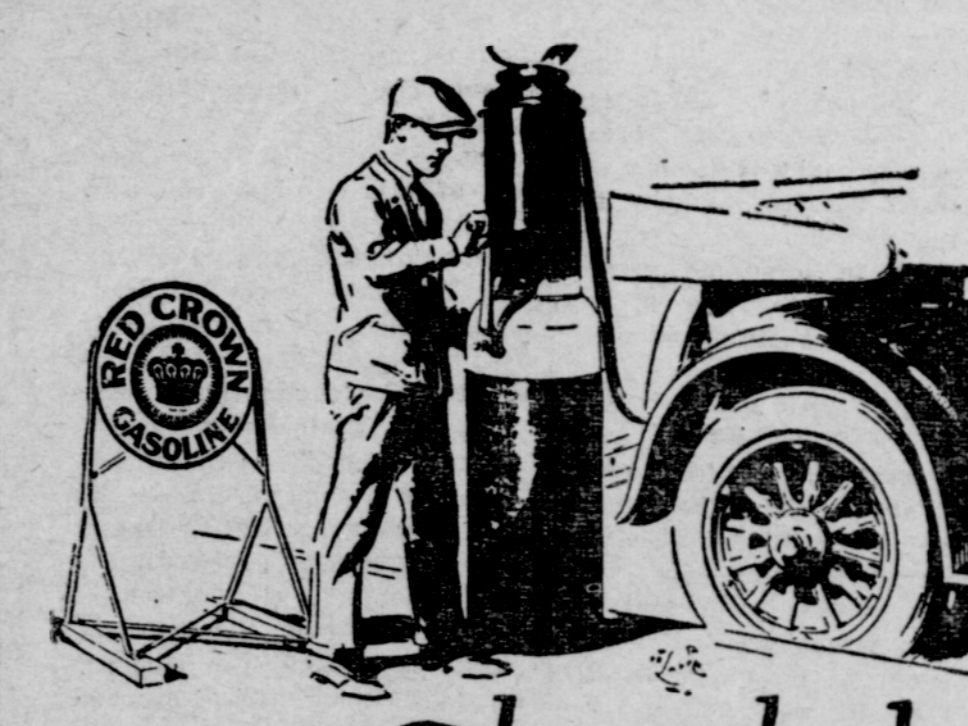
