REDDING CHAMBER OF COMMERCE IS GUTTED

REDDING, Calif., May 6.—The Chamber of Commerce building, a former brick warehouse at Trinity and California Streets, was gutted by fire during a stiff wind last evening.

The building recently was sold to McCormick, Saelzer Company and still was occupied by the Warren Construction Company, which lost its office equipment.

Considerable property was saved because Redding had a second steam fire engine. The members carried for blocks.

TWO CITIES AFTER LEGION CONCLAVE

Louisville, Ky., and Houston, Tex., Both Certain They Can Accommodate Hosts.

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., May 7.—At least two cities are bidding for the 1925 convention of the American Legion, according to national officers of the organization.

Louisville, Ky., claims to be able to handle the great crowds incident to such gatherings of veterans and hopes to demonstrate this fact on Derby Day, May 17. Houston, Texas, another aspirant, is planning presentation of proof of the hospitality of the Lone Star State to Legion officials at an early date.

Louisville, which annually handles a gathering of 80,000 on the occasion of the running of the great turf classic, claims added facilities, with the opening of two palatial hotels and real Legion activity. Jefferson Post, one of the largest in the country, has the use of a 123-acre tract—formerly Douglas Park—once one of the best-known race tracks in the country, given to the Legion by the Kentucky Jockey Club. This, Legion men believe, will prove a splendid place for reception of visitors. Ample auditorium space is available, it is said.

ARRAIGNMENT OF SENATOR WHEELER IS DELAYED

GREAT FALLS, Mont., May 6.—Arraignment of Senator Wheeler on the grand jury indictment charging him with accepting money to appear before the interior department for Gordon Campbell has been postponed pending the return of Federal Judge Pray.

The arraignment will probably be held and the case set for trial some time within the next six weeks, according to officials here. Judge Pray is holding court in Butte.

HOME FOR LEPERS ENLARGED AT CARVILLE

The first of the additional buildings provided by Congressional Act of February 20, 1923, to enlarge the National Leper Home at Carville, Louisiana, have been completed and twelve lepers who had been temporarily detained elsewhere were moved to Carville, April 4. Surgeon General Service, stated recently.

The additional buildings, all of which are under construction, will be rapidly made available for patients in the order of their completion and it is believed that they will be fully occupied within a few months. The appropriation, amounting to \$650,000, provides additional beds for approximately 240 patients and increases the present capacity of the institution to more than 400.

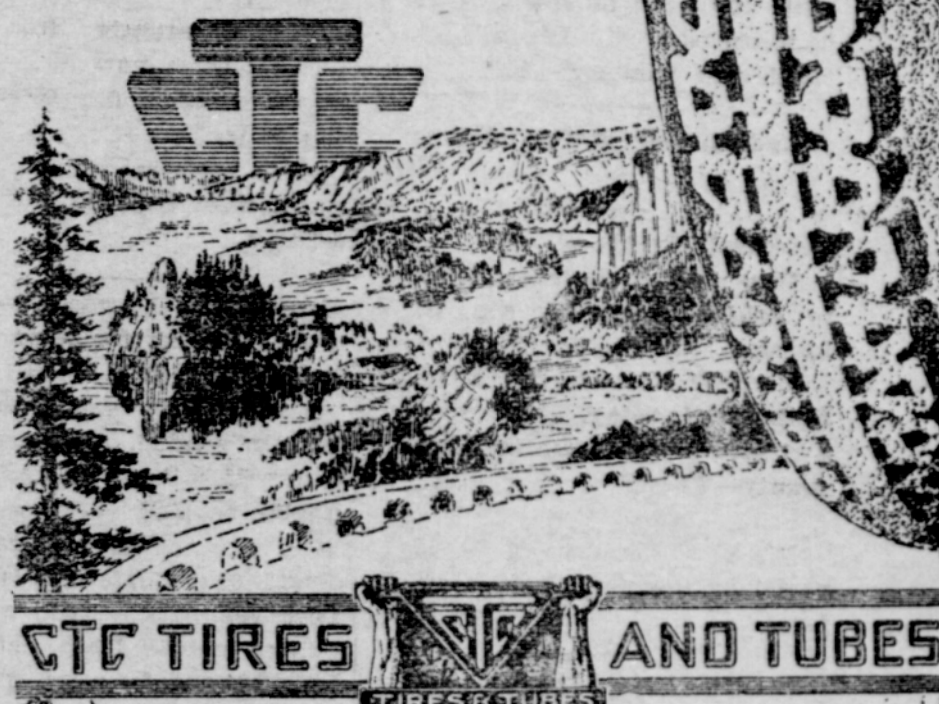

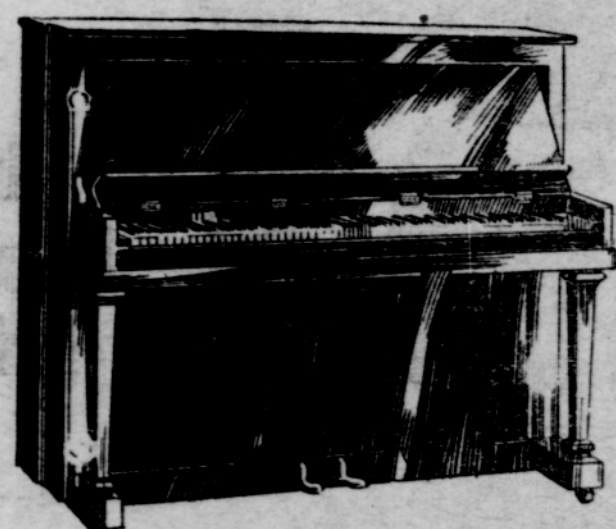

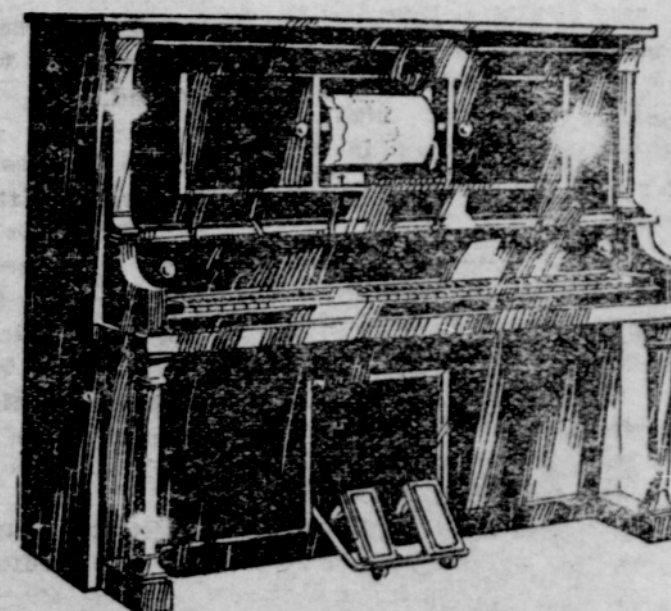
