ONE LANGUAGE

A few years ago there was great agitation for a universal language, one that would give the world medium expression. It will be recalled that many such languages were evolved and offered to the world.

In recent years it has been found the more practical procedure to wait patiently for the time when one language, possibly one now existing, should supplant all others, becoming the means of expression for the entire world.

Reasoning on the basis that the English language is now spoken by more people than any other, H. L. Mencken in his book, "The American Language," predicts that the English language will be the chosen language.

Without refuting Mencken and admitting that the English language has the "jump" on the situation Enrique Blanco, of the department of romance languages of the University of Wisconsin, provides the interesting thought that the Spanish language may become the universal tongue.

Blanco believes that unrestricted immigration in the United States, with millions of all races and nationalities pouring into this country annually and with thousands of Americanized immigrants annually emigrating back to Europe and Asia it was only a matter of time before English would be the only living language on earth.

But now that the United States has adopted rigid restrictions on immigration Blanco points out that fewer and fewer aliens will learn the English language, while the emigrants from Asia and Europe will pour into Spanish-speaking South American.

A universal language would be a boon to mankind and civilization and is a possible achievement for posterity, but now it is too early to attempt to surmise whether it will be English, Spanish, another existing tongue or an entirely new language.

A PRIZE EDITORIAL

The Omaha Bee recently conducted an editorial contest among its readers and Mrs. Charles L. Kelly, Nebraska City, Nebraska, a mother of five children, won first prize. Her editorial emphasizes a few points that some citizens in every community, may think seriously about with profit.

"My neighbor has prospered. His home is the last word in modern architecture and equipment. It is his hobby. He loves every block and board and nail in it. He surrounds it with grassy plots and flowers, and adorns it inside and out according to his sense of artistic grace and beauty.

"Not only is his home a source of pride and satisfaction to my neighbor, but by its beauty and grace and general attractiveness it sheds distinction and adds to the value of property around it.

"Now my home is a modest affair. It needs paint and the roof does not cover it as well as the mortgages does. What is meant for a grass plot shows bare patches like the exposed portions of a little boy's trousers. And instead of graceful flowing vines my house is overrun by little rosy ramblers who clamber about scraping off paint and leaving muddy streaks in their wake.

"To the hope I hold in their future the present struggle to keep them clothed, housed and fed is a small affair. They represent my family estate. To them I hope to leave an inheritance of character and courage. And to the world I shall not bequeath large sums to charity, schools or hospitals, but a family of men and women equipped to take up the problems of life.

"But when my neighbor begins to talk about taxes I have an uneasy feeling that according to his way of looking at it I should have drowned these dimpled babies before their eyes were open. He has figured out to a penny how much it is costing to educate one of my children.

"Now I am paying taxes too, but for nine months of the year by children are under supervision of trained teachers, men and women of unquestionable character and high ideals. It doesn't seem to me that they are receiving exorbitant wages. But my neighbor has no children. To him school is just a building that costs too much in the

first place, is costing too much in the upkeep, and doesn't give back a profit to the town.

"I believe my neighbor is wrong. My children have a monetary value to the town. For their needs my earnings are spent. I buy from him such things as he has to sell, thereby adding to his riches.

"I go farther. I am not raising hogs for profit nor cattle for market, but raw material for the nation tomorrow. They are not mine alone. They belong to my neighbor as well. It is to his interest as well as mine that they become fit and useful citizens. As they become trained, as they are educated, they will develop. The community has a part in that development.

"My neighbor has no more right to spread niggardly propaganda for cheap schools, a niggardly system that will dwarf the future of my children than I have to throw trash in his front yard."

Construct Toll Lines—The Pacific Telephone and Telegraph company is engaged in toll line construction in Josephine county at the present time. One part is between Grants Pass and Glendale Junction, and provides for the placing of 274 poles, 539 crossarms and 38 loop miles of copper wire, and miscellaneous pole line work to provide additional facilities in this section. The work will cost approximately \$23,000 and will be completed during the summer months. The Grants Pass-Rock Point work consists of reconstructing about three miles of pole line and stubbing the balance and replacing the deteriorated six-pin cross arms with standard 10-pin arms, to cost approximately \$10,000. It will be done by fall.
