NEWS LETTER

DENVER, May 20.—Textbook philosophy is a great help to the itinerant hobo, but the call of the jungle in the Spring is more fascinating, so some 75 undergraduates of Denver's labor college are hitting the trail for the great open spaces.

The call of the open, increasing in volume with the warm Spring sunshine, has reached its height in the lower sections of Denver, and it has been luring the student body way from James Eads Howe's "hobo college" since the annual baccalaureate sermon was preached and Dean Bob Smith announced that the academic year had ended, more than two weeks ago.

The Denver "hobo college" was the first of a series of similar institutions established by Howe, "millionaire hobo," in several of the large cities.

The winter students of the local college have occupied comfortable cots and chairs about a big, round stove, indulging in plenty of sleep and reading Schopenhauer, Karl Marx, Herbert Spencer, Jack London, Wells' Outline of History, and other writings—and working at intervals to contribute pro rata to the Mulligan stew and giant coffee pot.

A heated discussion of the definition of a hobo enlivened the last few days of the college year.

"Cities in the Summertime is no place for a real hobo," declared Mike the Bounce, one of the students. "We like the jungle in the Summertime. Let the bums
