LEPER MAY CAUSE STRIKE AT HOSPITAL

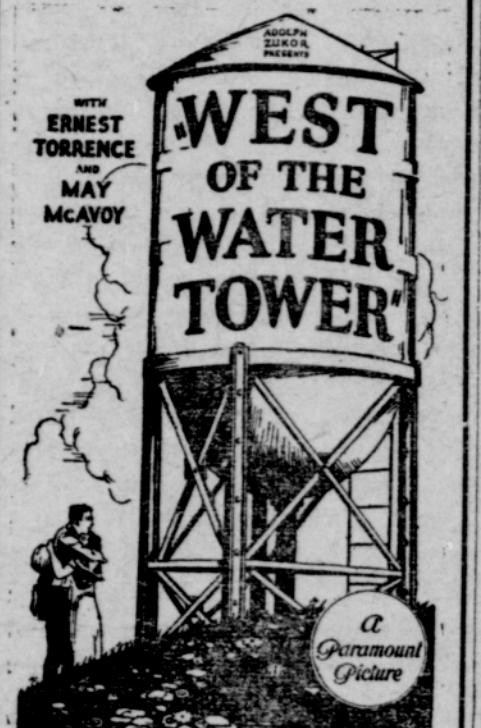

Mr. and Mrs. Lee Fifield have recently returned from their wedding trip and will be at home soon to their friends at No. 7872 Boulevard.

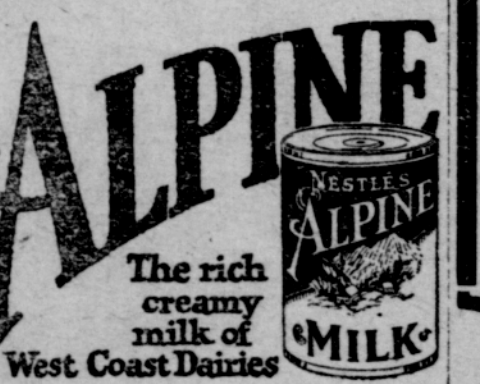
Entertained for Mr. and Mrs. B. L. Cooper

WIVES ARE GIVEN 70 PER CENT OF DIVORCES

CHICAGO, June 26:—One out of every 893 people in the United States is divorced annually. W. R. Shirley, of Muskogee, Okla.,

president of the National Fraternal Congress, said in an address here.

"Divorces in this country have increased 25 per cent since 1916," said Mr. Shirley, whose organization represents a fraternal membership of 10,000,000. "Decreases granted in 1922 numbered 148,554 for the whole country, while in 1916 the total was 112,033.

"The United States grants twenty times as many divorces as Canada in proportion to its population.

"Wives receive approximately 70 per cent of the divorces and husbands only 30 per cent."

DONNER LAKE WATER SOUGHT BY MEADOWS

RENA, Nev., June 26:—Water from Donner Lake may be released to the Truckee River to aid the farmers of the Truckee Meadows. This is the statement authorized yesterday by directors of the Truckee Water Users' Association.

Negotiations are progressing for use of the lake water and W. R. Gelatt and association owners of the Donner Lake Company

have expressed their readiness to co-operate in saving the crops in western Nevada.

Like other mountain lakes in the Sierras, Donner is unusually low but sufficient water is reported available to materially aid the farmers if the water is released immediately after the first crops are cut.

LIFTING OF BAN IS STRONGLY PROTESTED

RENO, Nev., June 26:—Determined opposition to modification of the foot and mouth quarantine against California was voiced yesterday by representatives of Texas, New Mexico, and Wyoming at the convention of the Western States Livestock Sanitary Association.

A committee was appointed to thoroughly investigate the proposed modification of the existing quarantine with instructions to present a report this morning for consideration by the entire convention.
