MEDICAL MEN WILL HOLD CONFERENCE AT PORTLAND

PORTLAND, Aug. 4.—Leading health officers of California, Oregon and Washington and British Columbia in addition to several medical men from various parts of the country will attend the conference of Pacific Coast health authorities here August 6, 7, and 8.

Sessions will be held at the public library and papers will be read and discussion opened on all phases of public health and general matters of sanitation. Nurses' institute will be held each morning. Dr. Frederick D. Stricker, state health officer of Oregon, is president of the organization of coast health authorities.

Dr. W. M. Dickie, state health officer of California is scheduled to make two addresses at the opening session. His topics will be: "Standardized Interstate Auto and Camp Regulations" and "Public Health." Others on the program for the day are: Dr. Paul A. Turner, state health commissioner of Washington, "Uniform State Health Legislation," Dr. Robert H. Mullen, minister of health Vancouver, B. C., "Reliable Bill of Health"; Colonel G. M. Magruder, U. S. Public Health Service, Seattle, "Disease Prevention Work of the U. S. P. H. S.," Dr. N. E. Wayson, U. S. P. H. S. San Francisco, "Laboratory Work U. S. P. H. S."

Selection of the next meeting place and election of officers will be held in the afternoon. The foot and mouth disease, smallpox and tuberculosis prevention, and diphtheria control are among the topics to be discussed at the second day session. General matters of public health will make up the final day's program.

Organization of the Oregon branch of the American public Health Service will be effected after the program. The Nurses' institute will center its conference about infant care and allied topics.

MEN PICK ASHLAND AS LOGICAL PLACE FOR NEW STATION

That Ashland was chosen from among all the cities between Los Angeles and Portland as the logical location for a new service station was the statement last night of Ernest Williams, on the new W. & N. station on the Boulevard.

Deciding to enter the service station business, Frederick Newland, the other partner in the enterprise, started from Los Angeles and drove to Portland, carefully checking over the volume of tourist and local traffic in each city. After he had completed his survey, he wired Williams, his father-in-law, to come to Ashland.

Although business is at present only normal, the new service men have adopted a business-like attitude, and are going out after trade, instead of waiting for it to come. This is being largely accomplished through the medium of advertising. "After we get the trade, our service and products will hold it," said Williams last night.

In a month or two, Williams is going to Green's hotel, Pasadena, leaving Newland in charge of the station. At the big hotel, Williams will be purchasing steward, or manager's assistant.

When he was 14, Williams started in the hotel business at the Bull hotel, Dartford, Kent, England. He received \$1.50 a week and board for his services. Since then he has been employed in the leading hotels in England, Canada and America. For a time, he was purchasing steward at the Holbond, in London, called England's best hotel. His wife occupied the position of chef.

When Mr. Williams came from Canada to America, he was employed as butler in a prominent New York millionaire family, and his wife was employed as chef. As he has been in the catering business all his life, he intends to return to it as soon as his Ashland enterprise is established.

DAMAGES ASKED FOR FLOODING OF LAND

KLAMATH FALLS, Aug. 2.—Suit to recover \$23,747 has been brought by P. G. Brown in circuit court here against the Fort Klamath Meadows Company and the Meadows Drainage District. Suit is based on the allegation that since 1920 the defendants have flooded 400 acres of his land by the construction of a dyke which diverted two creeks from their natural course.

The land in question lies at the northern end of Upper Klamath Lake.

SALEM, Aug. 4.—Will H. Moore, state insurance commissioner, has prepared a public letter urging all persons having dealings with real estate agents to keep copies of any agreements they make for the purchase or sale of property. This procedure Mr. Moore said, would aid his department materially in bringing unscrupulous real estate dealers to justice.



Health Hints by the Father of Physical Culture

Fruits are nature's most finished foods. I do not mean most nutritious or most necessary, though they are important to a healthful diet, but rather that, as they come ripe from the parent plant, they are complete in flavor and digestibility and can rarely be improved upon.

Very few fruits, when thoroughly ripened, are improved by cooking. And in this case as in that of leafy vegetables, we have good scientific reason for eating at least a part of such food raw. The anticorbutic vitamin is very abundant in acid fruits, orange or lemon juice being the standard remedy for scurvy. Other fresh acid fruits have similar effects, notably the tomato, which is really a fruit in its composition and dietetic uses.

Fruit acids in general seem to have some distinct tendency to perform in the body, which is probably associated with this particular vitamin since its power is quickly destroyed when the acids are neutralized with alkalies. Thus to add soda, to tomatoes as is sometimes done in making tomato soup, is to destroy their most valuable property.

The fruit acids are often combined mineral salts which must not be confused with alkalies. These acids and salts give the fruit its distinctive qualities. Other than these elements the chief ingredient is sugar.

Adding sugar to fruit does not improve its nutritive qualities, except to give additional heating and fat-producing elements. Cane sugar is less wholesome, especially in the diet of the young, than are the natural sugars of fruits. Fruits may be sweetened with profit when the object is to furnish a heavier diet but when there is a tendency to over-eat or accumulate fat, cane sugar should be kept down to a minimum and fruits eaten as nearly as possible in their natural state.

In order to be perfect for eating uncooked and unsweetened, fruits should be thoroughly ripened on the parent plant.

The banana is much more delicious when thoroughly ripened.

BRITISH FLYERS STILL ARE AT PETROPALOVSK

TOKIO, August 2.—A. Stuart MacLaren, the British aviator, and his flying companions, who are attempting to beat the American birdmen around the globe, are still at Petropavlovsk, Kamchatka, a radio message received today announced. No details were received, but it is believed that they are weatherbound.

For several days, no word was received from the British flyers, and it was feared that they had met with some trouble.
