ALTHOUGH the "cake eater" in the slang sense of the word is a strictly modern product, there has always been cake making from earliest days and consequently cake eating and cake eaters. And cake pans.

or, the swirl, the bustle of a modern city are too much for him. He utters a prayer of thanksgiving when the steamship he boards trails out of the harbor and he is on his way back to the reaches of the grazing grounds, where he watches his master's flocks.

But since Nihaui in general refuses to come to progress, progress went to it. Army air service officers, desirous of having photographs of the coast lines of Kauai and of the vast rock of Kaula, an ancient volcanic headland which looms up out of the Pacific south and slightly west of Nihaui, went to the port of Ahukini, on Kauai, taking with them aboard their steamer an airplane equipped for aerial camera work. After completing their mission on Kauai, the pilot and his photographer set out on a fine morning for Kaula, which they reached at 11,000 feet, and circled around until they had a dozen pictures taken.

Crossing Nihaui on the way back to Kauai, the pilot decided that it would be worth while landing on the former block of land. Accordingly, he nosed his ship down until he was flying low over the countryside, chose a likely field, circled to come into the wind and set his wheels down in

a great cloud of dust. Sheep and natives alike scattered. The former ran wildly. They had no idea what had come to visit them, but apparently they were not anxious to stay and see. The natives, many of whom had heard of airplanes, followed the lead of their sheep. None, however, could quite overcome the curiosity which surged within their minds, and after running for a quarter of a mile, they came to a stop, faced about and watched. Coaxing by the pilot and his camera man was unavailing. None of them wanted to come a bit closer. In fact, several thought they were still too near.

After a stay of an hour and a half, the plane took off and continued on its way to Kauai, where it landed safely.

Business men of the Territory who have been planning to establish an air-line connecting the various islands since hearing the story, have decided to leave Nihaui to its own fate.
