Reds Would Inaugurate Class Rule in Lieu of Democracy Says Gompers

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18.—Real co-operation between farmers and wage earners is not helped by the multitudinous fiascos in the field of so-called farmer-labor political effort, according to Samuel Gompers, president of the American Federation of Labor.

In a statement Gompers declared that the "convention held in St. Paul June 17 was an example of the kind of fraudulent farmer-labor pyrotechnics that hamper true co-operation between agriculturists and wage earners, because they tend to create misunderstandings on the one hand and arouse suspicion on the other."

"Who can be seriously blamed if after such a spectacle as that in St. Paul he concludes that talk of farmer-labor co-operation is futile or waste?" asked Gompers in the current issue of the American Federationist.

"There is a great and growing community of interest between the tillers of the soil and the wage earners of the cities, but that interest is not going to be served by the soap-box brigade that peddles its nostrums from almost every corner in these parlous times."

Gompers pointed out that "as producers, farmers and wage earners stand in precisely the same position. As consumers they also stand in the same position."

"In the great democracy of America there is no division along distinctly proletarian or class lines, either in politics or industry," Gompers declared. "There is a distinction between the useful and the useless, those who serve and those who are purely parasitic. That is quite different from a distinction between proletarian and bourgeois, the latter being one of the bogeys of the ridiculous communist propaganda."

Gompers feels that the kind of co-operation that American farmers and American wage earners want is the kind that leads to constructive betterment of American life for the masses of the American people.

"The St. Paul convention declared itself for a workers and farmers government which would mean the end of democracy in America," the veteran head of the American Federation said.

"Of course the Reds set up the shout that we have always had a Wall Street Government, and upon that assertion they partly rest their claim that it is right to get the other kind if they can."

"The argument is specious in the extreme. Granted that Wall Street has exercised a powerful and at times dominating influence upon American national government, there never has been any real bar to an onsting of that government or to popular influence on that government, or to a voice for everybody who could make himself heard—and it has never been a Wall Street Government in the sense that the communists demand a workers' government."

"The machinery of democracy in political life has been and is available to the people, and they may take advantage of it as they choose and as they are able to unite on a program of action."

That the St. Paul platform proposes, according to Gompers, is "a capture of the Government and its subsequent destruction. They want, he said, a government of those two groups alone—Farmer and Labor—to the exclusion of all others—a class government instead of a Democratic Government."

"Some Americans," Gompers went on, "are slow to learn the true meaning and purpose of communist propaganda. They are slow to believe that dictatorship of the proletariat means what it seems to mean. They are slow to believe that real destruction of democracy is intended. They are slow to believe that the communist machine is just as sinister as it seems to be, that it is in every country a part of an international organization dedicated to the destruction of democracy everywhere."

"The St. Paul convention has come and gone. Like every other move on the part of the communists, it has taught its lesson for those who are willing to learn."

RAILS TO LINK LOS ANGELES TO MEXICO CITY BEFORE LONG

NOGALES, Arizona, Aug. 18.—Railroad construction work now being conducted by the Sul Pacific Co. of Mexico between Mazatlan and Tepic, Simalao, Mexico, in which more than \$500,000 is being spent in improvements, is progressing rapidly, according to officials of the road recently in this city from headquarters in Tepic.

The work now under construction will connect the West Coast of Mexico with Mexico City via Guadalupe and will further provide a through line from this city to the interior, obviating the now necessary trip through Laredo and El Paso, Texas.

At the present time, work has been cut down considerably due to the semi-tropic rains which have started in the district where construction is being carried on, but resumption of activities will be in full swing within the next two months.

Rails Station is used as concentration point, where a large camp is maintained and where excavation work is under way for the laying of the roadbed at that point. Side tracks have been constructed down the course of the San Pedro River for conveniences in loading ballast necessary in the program of building. Most of the work at this place is in the nature of rebalancing, leveling and grading.

It is the desire of engineers to make this gap a lasting affair. Consequently, most of the bridge and viaduct is of reinforced concrete and steel, and a high-grade roadbed is being installed.

With the completion of the road, which will take several years, a direct line will be provided between Los Angeles and Mexico City, with through trains running between these two points.
