A Chronicle of Events Occurring in World Centers of Population

LONDON, Aug. 20.—The clock-work regularity of the British Court is threatened with disruption, and all because of great expectation of a happy event in Goldsbrough Hall, Princess Mary's Yorkshire home.

For the last sixty years the Court has moved to the seclusion of Balmoral Castle in the last days of July. This year the court pilgrimage to Scotland awaits the arrival of a tiny visitor.

It may be September before King George and Queen Mary cross the Tweed. The King will linger at Bolton Abbey to be in the neighborhood, and the Queen will stay at Goldsbrough Hall.

During the London season the Queen has daily chatted with the Princess by telephone.

Continental trains are bringing hordes of Americans to London from Paris and the Summer heat of Italy. Even the prospects of rain in England fail to dampen the ardor of Americans who have attempted to brave the heat of Southern Europe.

Many Americans are in Scotland for the shooting season.

Scottish shooting lodges have been rented to Americans for huge figures. Mr. and Mrs. Burling, of White Plains, N. Y., have taken Foray Lodge, in Perthshire, and not far away are Mr. and Mrs. C. Ramsdell, of Boston and Chicago who have rented a moor from the Marquis of Graham.

Mrs. Harry Brown, of Pittsburgh, who has been a successful entre into London society, has decided not to take a lodge, but will make a short trip into Scotland. It is reported that Mrs. Brown's three months' lease of Norfolk House, London, is costing her \$10,000.

London is a city of millionaires, thanks to the American tourists. Every luxury is being sought by the American tourists from the minute they leave their ship at Southampton until they depart.

Southampton's boys about town—the lads who always gather to see the trains come in and go out—are astounded at the latest innovation. A luxurious cream-colored coach is now added to every boat train.

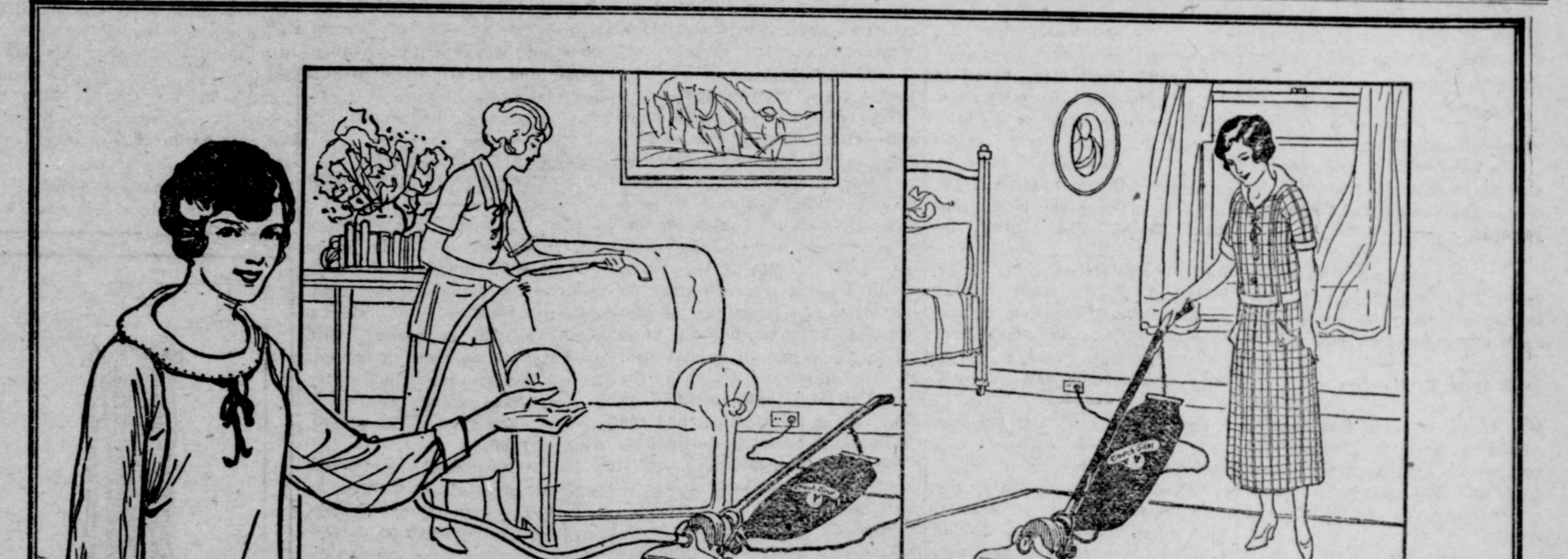
