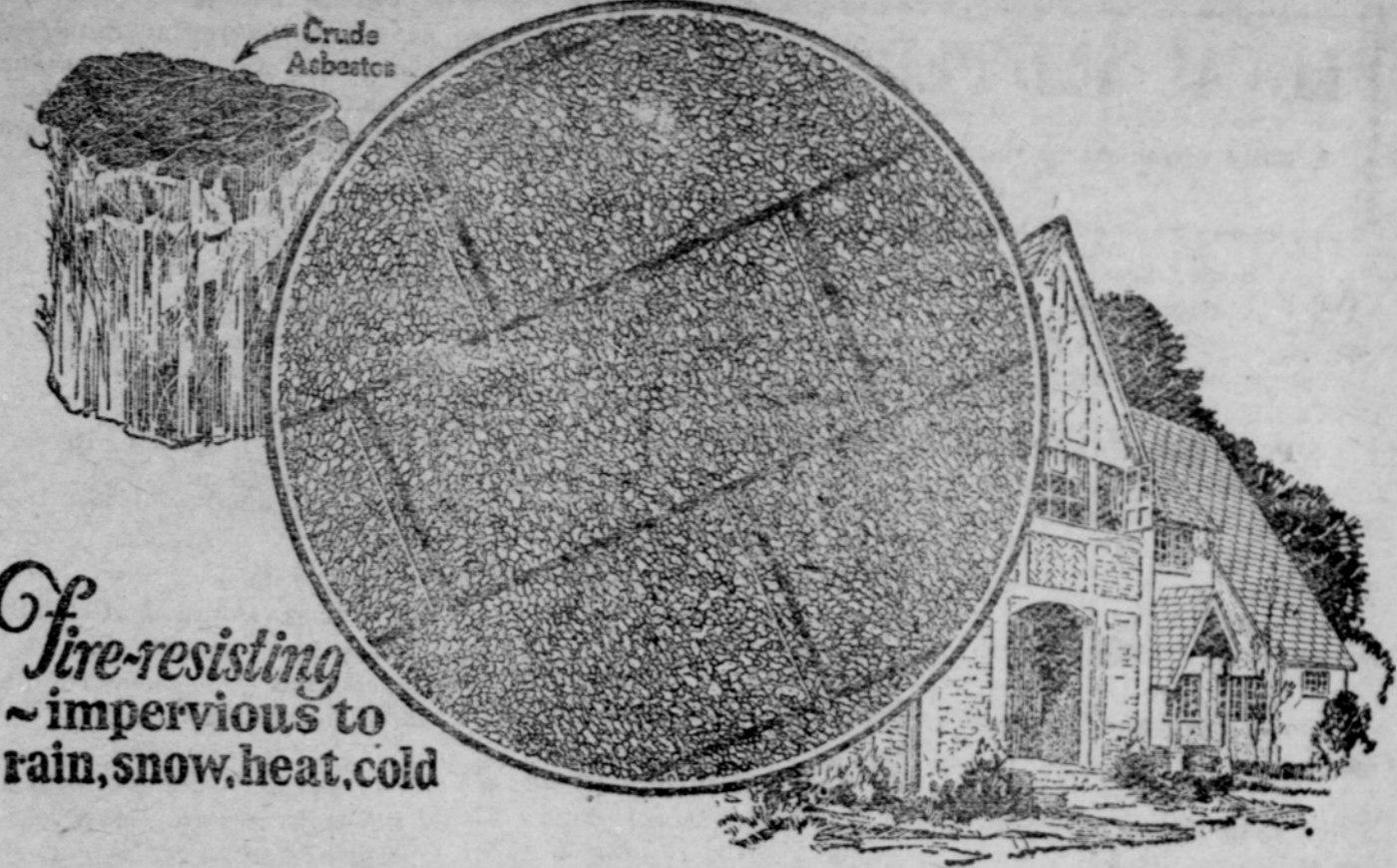
WARN FRATERNITIES ABOUT STREET USE
