The article, which centers around Mr. Moses' home in Ashland Creek Canyon, tells of the fear which birds and animals felt when he first went to the wilderness mum, 93; Minimum, 52, Maximum home and then continues:

"We put a stop to all shooting of firearms on the place. Then we cleared away the brush and logs and stumps and rocks, and made a great big fine lawn that was kept fresh and green by irrigation. We planted a vegetable garden and a flower garden, and put in strawberry plants and raspberry and blackberry bushes.

"First thing we knew we had a lot of birds come and make their home with us. At the start they were quite shy, but we never molested them, and now most of them are about as tame as chickens. We have robins, humming birds, chickadees, nuthatches, wood-peckers, purple finches, juncoes, hermit thrushes, orioles, quail, grouse, blue jays, whiskey jacks and others I am unable to identify.

"We feed the birds every day, and they come to their meals as regularly as a hired man. Of course, the quail and grouse are still timid, having been shot at so often, but they are gradually becoming acquainted with us, and some of these days I look for them to take their board with us like other species. The whiskey jacks are very bold and fearless, coming to my hand for food with no misgivings whatever.

"Then we have a salt lick for the deer. Every night they come and hold a jamboree over the treat. On moon light nights we can watch them from the windows, and sometimes they stay around the lick until after daylight. Occasionally the beautiful creatures come near the cabin in open daylight, and often I see them as I go up and down the Canyon road.

"Being kind to animals has its disadvantages too, for there are certain creatures of the wild, just as there are certain human creatures, whose companionship is not wanted.

"Among these undesired creatures are porcupines. Just what they are good for and just why God thought it necessary to create them science has not yet explained.

"What attracts the porcupines to the cabin seems to be my flowers. I have them all around the cabin, bordered with the finest pansies that ever ran the riot of endless colors. I guess there must be at least 200 feet of these pansies around the buildings. And I have a particularly fine bed of pansies at the base of the big Douglas fir that lifts its head many feet into the air out in the front yard.

"I will not tell you the details about the toads, the lizards, the snakes, the gophers, the moles, the rats, and the mice that have taken advantage of the environment we have created, but we have them to contend with too. Toads and lizards and snakes are quite useful in destroying bugs, insects and other undesirable things, but the gophers, moles, rats and mice are to be classified with the porcupines as plain damn nuisances. We put them out of the way painlessly as we can. They are just about as smart as we are, and eliminating them calls for a lot of real intelligence.

"Now, then, we come to the moral of this little essay on 'Environment.' You can attract anything you want with the right environment. If you run a store or a factory or anything else where the service is pleasing, you will find more and more people coming to buy your goods. If your clerks are courteous, and if you run the place on the basis of always doing the right thing, why, bless me, you will have to add some more stories to the building and buy the property adjoining to take care of your increased trade. Success in everything is simply finding out what people want and giving it to them.

"Naturally you will attract some undesirable animals, but that is a part of the Divine Plan-the bad follows the good wherever it goes.

"To hold fast to the good and eliminate the bad-that is about all there is to this thing we call life."






