The only expression in any way favorable to the decision of the judge from a person of prominence comes from William Jennings Bryan, and is as follows:

"I am glad that the judge gave Loeb and Leopold life sentences instead of capital punishment. I have had a feeling, growing for years, against capital punishmentagainst taking of human life under any circumstances.

Undervaluation for life should never be encourage !. That is the principle which has aroused a storm of protest against warfare and which has stirred up a horror at the increasing number of murders which occur each year in this country.

And the same principle should create disapproval of any judicial decision which fails to give capital punish- them prisoners in the strikers' ment where the murder is so disgusting and inexcusable camp as the Franks murder was. Capital punishment is the surest and safest preventative of heinous murders. Murderers working for large stakes might be willing to play against the odds of life imprisonment-with always the chance that a pardon might be procured after a short period-but they would hesitate committing dastardly crimes if they knew that death awaited them upon conviction.

Pardons are too easily procured these days for any loophole to be left in cases as unprovoked and dastardly as the Franks murder.
