Paris Style Hint - PARIS, Sept. 29. - Perfumes are keeping step with fast-changing fashion, and new scents come into vogue continually. Perfumers, as well as dress-makers, seem to be running to

bright colors this season, and the color must suit the odor, according to the latest dictum. gaining to work back to the national forests," said Mr. Eldridge. "Until now the cuttings were all done on private lands easily accessible to railroads. These lands now are being denuded, and the railroads are advancing to the boundaries of the national forests.

"This means that we must devise a plan for systematic cutting and reforestation, so that the national forests will be paying investment and a constant source of timber supply".

Long-Time Rotation Aim The forest management plan, devised to meet this need, will soon be operating in Oregon, Mr. Eldridge said. This plan provides for division of a timber area into enough tracts to secure continuous cutting for 100 years. At the end of this time the first tract will have been seeded over and grown up so that trees 100 years old may be cut off again. The plan amounts to a long-time rotation of crops.

As safeguards of the system, seeding must be assured, by careful burning of slashes in wet seasons so as not to injure the seeds lying dormant in the cut-over land. A further safeguard is the leaving of small groves of trees uncut, to scatter seed. These trees are protected from possible

"old-slash" fires by carefully clearing brush from the ground around them.

BETTER CUTTING OF TIMBER WILL BE STARTED SOON

Systematic exploitation of Oregon's national forest timber is now starting, and will reach its peak within the next decade, according to I. F. Eldridge, forest inspector, of Washington, D. C., now in Portland on an inspection tour of northwest forest regions.

Unlike private timberland exploitation, cutting in national forests will not leave denuded waste in its wake, but will, by a system of periodic cutting, provide a constant timber increase in a 100-year cutting cycle.
