LORD MAYOR OF LONDON CHOSEN

LONDON, Sept. 29.—With civic pomp and centuries-old ceremonial, Alderman Sir Alfred Louis Bower, was today elected Lord Mayor of London for the year commencing November 9, in succession to Sir Louis Nektou.

There was no actual election in the popular sense, for astonishing as it may seem in these days of universal suffrage and popular elections, the citizens of the capital of the British Empire have nothing to do with the selection of their Chief magistrate. London's Lord Mayor is chosen by the Aldermen, Court of Common Council, and the "Liverymen," or members of the ancient trade guilds. Usually they select the senior alderman, but in the present case the senior, Alderman Briggs, being over 80, felt himself too old for the post and declined the honor. Bower was next on the roll.

Shortly after 11 a. m. the civic dignitaries began to assemble in the Council Chamber at the historic Guildhall, and after formal proceedings, the picturesquely garbed Common Crier announced that the city fathers would proceed with the serious task of selecting the new Lord Mayor in secret session, and called upon all "strangers," or unauthorized folk, to withdraw. These were ceremoniously escorted from the chamber by "beadles" and burly City policemen, after a few people had put forward ancient claims to be present, claims which were promptly over-ruled by the presiding officer, the present Lord Mayor.

NEW TRIAL IN A GRANTS PASS CASE

A retrial of the case against Dr. E. J. Billick, charged with manslaughter, will in all probability be asked by Prosecuting Attorney W. T. Miller, it was announced today from the office of the district attorney. The jury reported at noon yesterday that it was unable to agree on a verdict, being hopelessly divided between acquittal and conviction. Judge C. M. Thomas discharged

the jury, after the foreman had announced that they would not be able to arrive at any verdict. The jury went behind closed doors Saturday morning at 3 o'clock, following the instructions by the judge. Early that afternoon they returned to again receive instructions and that evening reported that they would be unable to arrive at a verdict. Judge Thomas sent the jurors back to the jury room for longer deliberation but no progress was forthcoming. The six to six vote

stood throughout the night and all of Sunday morning. The vote stood the same way when they reported back to the judge. Stating that he wants a court decision on the charge, Prosecuting Attorney Miller indicated that he would ask Judge Thomas to set a new trial for the January term of court. He had no comment to make on the outcome of

the case with the exception of the indication that a new trial might be called.—Grants Pass Courier.
