BIG INTEREST IN HOME LIGHTING CONTEST LOCALLY

The Home Lighting Easy Contest, which is being conducted in the territory including Southern Oregon and Northern California, from Roseburg, Oregon, on the North, to Dunsmuir, California, on the South, was estimated to have 1500 contestants in this territory, at the time plans for the contest were first made on September 1st, but the school children after being told the story of the contest and the work to be done in order to compete for the prize, has shown such great interest and signified their intention of entering the contest by signing the registration card, that the plans of the committee were changed to include 3500 contestants instead of the original estimate of 1500, showing that this contest met with much enthusiasm among the children and students in the Grammar and High Schools of eligible age.

The primers, badges and newspaper lessons have all been distributed to the 3500 students in the schools and they are very busy at work, all with the intention of winning one of the valuable cash prizes. The winners of the local prizes will be automatically entered in the International contest, and each school has determined also to win one of the International prizes, thereby bringing honor and glory to their school.

It is interesting to note from all reports that the International contest has assumed greater proportions all over the United States and Canada than was ever dreamed of when the plan was made. As early as September 15th, orders had been placed with the Society for Electrical Development for one million primers. As this was very early, and before the campaign had gotten under way, it is assumed that at present this figure has grown to about three million. Before the contest is completed it will have assumed greater proportion than any National educational contest in the history of the United States and Canada.
