Paris Style Hint—
PARIS, Oct. 20. — Even the little handkerchief changes fashion ever so often. It first came into being as a round bit of fancy work, so history tells us; and in France square ones were not seen until under the reign of Louis XIV.

There are plenty of charming ones to be found in Paris, which is really the paradise for handkerchiefs. Probably the most delightful ones are those edged with real Valenciennes lace, applied to the edge in curves following the design of the lace.

The Maison de Blanc, which specializes in these little articles, is showing them made of the finest linen, hand-woven by old women in the north of France, sheer enough, indeed, for any queen. The lace, too, of course, is all handmade.

Even Paris still has her lace makers, who sit about in the public gardens, making their three hundred and one bobbin fly as fast as the wind.

Simpler in effect, but equally beautiful, are the linen handkerchiefs with wide, openwork borders, which form a piece of lattice-work above the hem. Small

colored "hankies" of linen or cambric have hand-scalloped borders of white, which show delicately against the pale pink, old blue, or yellow and apricot of the handkerchief itself.

The newest thing, which gives the touch of bright color so necessary this season, is the checked handkerchief with a colored hem. They come in white linen, with borders, wide or narrow, in bright green, blue, scarlet, or any other color of the rainbow. The checks are formed of fine thin lines, in color, to correspond with the border. These handkerchiefs are usually larger.

Color has even invaded the men's wardrobe in the form of brightest handkerchiefs, which smart shirtmakers are displaying. Some are in pink or blue, with stripes, two inches wide, banding each side of the square some dis-

tance from the hem. Some plain white handkerchiefs are given a band effect by a series of heavy threads woven into the fine linen somewhat above the hem. Others show a hemline stripe of color by way of a border.

Colleges Conducting Unique Competition
