LET'S DO OUR SHARE

Almost without exception, the keynote of the speeches made by the members of the Portland Chamber of Commerce given at the luncheon held in their honor yesterday was co-operation. Each and every one of them was emphatic in his declaration that through co-operation only would a success be made of the campaign now being waged to make for a "Greater Oregon."

The two great cities of California, San Francisco and Los Angeles long ago realized the need for co-operation in developing themselves as well as in developing the cities which contribute to their support. Los Angeles has perhaps realized this need a great deal longer than her sister city, and as a result, Los Angeles has passed San Francisco as the largest and most prosperous city in California. The cities surrounding Los Angeles, Santa Monica, Long Beach, Huntington Beach, Venice have all grasped the idea, and have given their full support to this measure, which has made Los Angeles the city she is today.

Are we in Ashland going to grasp the opportunity offered us by the Portland Chamber of Commerce? What Los Angeles and San Francisco have done for California, Portland, with the aid of the other cities of the state can do for Oregon. And we can do even more than has been accomplished in California. For where the state just south of us has one natural advantage, we have ten. It is up to us to grasp these natural advantages, and pulling together, with our larger sister, help Oregon take the place she so justly deserves, the greatest state in the greatest country in the world.

MODERN HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION

As one travels over the hard surfaced highways in a state like Oregon or California he is impressed with the difference between the roads built from five to ten years ago and modern trend in road construction.

The old road, from 18 to 20 feet wide, is being replaced by roads where the grading runs almost from fence to fence on either side of the highway.

This requires no more work than digging ditches along the sides of the road as in the past and it adds immeasurably to the safety of the highways. It makes them virtually the width of a city street as on either side of the paved strip in the center there is plenty of room for one or more cars to pass.

In other words, highways are being widened out sufficiently so that five or six cars may stand abreast. This eliminates, to a large extent, the danger of accidents from passing vehicles.

A second feature that one observes is the tendency to build shoulders, some two feet wide on each side of old pavements and cover the space in between with a new surface of asphaltic concrete. This is the old paving base salvaged by a new shock absorbing cushion which will withstand the impact of modern traffic.

Western states are leading the way in these new methods of road construction which include widening the whole grade and strengthening and widening old pavements in the manner indicated.

A BAD BARGAIN

There is ample justification for the recent order of Secretary of the Navy Wilbur requiring graduates of the naval academy to serve two years in the navy after graduation before resigning their commissions. Sixty members of the last graduating class resigned immediately upon completion of their school course.

The government has provided an expensive institution for the benefit of those who attend the academy. It pays heavily to maintain it. It offers a free education, and in addition it pays students \$780 a year for the privilege of educating them. The unwritten understanding is, of course, that the young men are to serve at least for a time in the navy.

But the students are too frequently canceling their part of the contract. They take the free education and the government's money while being educated, and give nothing to the government in return.

It is obviously a bad bargain for the government, and one which Secretary Wilbur should be commended for correcting.

Kill The State Income Tax

Vote for Repeal of Tax Law Which Retards State Growth

Many Millions Diverted from Investment that would Provide Home Market for Oregon Agricultural Products

EVIDENCE FULLY PROVES DAMAGE DONE

Documents Examined by Citizens of Every Part of Oregon—Read Their Appeal to Voters—No other Pacific Coast State has Income Tax Law

Harmful effects of the state income tax law upon state development are set forth in the following appeal to the voters of Oregon: WE HAVE EXAMINED copies of the documentary evidence as to the effect of a state income tax upon Oregon. We are satisfied as to the genuineness of the documents.

We find that this evidence substantiates the claim that many millions of dollars have been diverted from investment in Oregon districts that would provide a home market for Oregon agricultural products.

We find the damage is so serious and of such extent that we appeal to our neighbors and to voters in all parts of Oregon to vote for the repeal of the present state income tax and to oppose the enactment of any new state income tax bill at least until such time as the other Pacific Coast states have enacted similar legislation so they cannot grow at Oregon's expense.

We do not object to paying a state income tax, but we do object to imposing a tax that keeps capital out of our state, retards state development and tends to leave our farmers dependent upon distant markets.

We resent the tendency to give Oregon the reputation of being a "backward state." Oregon's resources and the courage and enterprise of her pioneer people entitle her to a great destiny. Let us all join hands to rid Oregon of legislation that handicaps Oregon development.
