Republican Ticket and Platform

The Jackson County Republican organization is composed of fifty-six precinct committeemen, an executive committee of eleven members, a women's advisory committee of eleven members, one woman member of the state executive committee, a state committeeman, a congressional committeeman, making a total of eighty-one members who are the lawfully constituted representatives of the republican party in Jackson county.
