THE GOVERNMENT CORPORATION

It would be very hard indeed, to imagine any Ashland business man, a stockholder in a private corporation, the expenditures of which yearly totaled well in the billions of dollars, ever missing a stockholders' meeting, or losing an opportunity to cast his vote in order to determine the policy of that corporation.

But with an opportunity offered them to select leaders for a still larger corporation, the activities of which overshadow anything carried on by any private concern, the Corporation of the United States, a great number of them decline to cast a ballot. Why, no one knows but the truth of the above statement is a proved fact.

Ashland may be taken as a typical city of the United States and Oregon. In the last presidential election, that of 1920, there were 54,165,905 citizens in the United States eligible to vote. Of this number, 26,646,237 cast a ballot. Less than fifty per cent of the eligible voters of the country elected a president to govern one hundred per cent of the eligible voters. In 1896, eighty per cent of the eligible voters of the country went to the polls and voted. In 1900, seventy-three per cent cast their ballot, in 1908, sixty-six per cent, in 1912, sixty-two per cent, in 1920, less than fifty per cent, in 1924, what?

LAURA JEAN LIBBEY PASSES

One of the last of the older romanticists passed in the death of Laura Jean Libbey. Only her own generation knew why the papers found space to print it. For she was one of those who linger on the very boundary of oblivion, and are summoned back for a single fleeting instant, and then for evermore are dead, quite dead, in a literary way. But in her time, Miss Libbey tapped as many tear ducts as the best of them, or the worst, and was perhaps the darling author of more hired girls than anyone else ever captivated. You have to glance at the titles of her books, "When His Love Grew Cold," "A Forbidden Marriage."

Ab, what a company they were, those peers and contemporaries of Laura Jean Libbey. And they had little competition, save Dickens and the poets, who could not possibly minister to the growing craving for something to read, for anything to read, "The Duchess" who was an Irish girl, Margaret Hungerford; Mrs. E. D. E. N. Southworth, E. P. Roe, and Mary Jane Holmes. They wrote prodigiously and with unflagging romanticisms, and some of that which they write was very passable literature. Mr. Roe's novels seem to have been deservedly popular, while the prolific output of Miss Holmes found favor to the extent of 2,000,000 purchased copies. She wrote, you recall, "Tempest an Sunshine." The book is quite as obvious as its title. A study in contrasts, more melodramatically engineered, a theme for Marie Corelli, yet as we remember it a rather readable book. Certainly there is worse stuff being written today,

and being bought, and blurbled, and foisted upon a public trained to like it. Of the books that issue today from our industrious presses, as free from their product as a spawning carp, it is not likely that a greater percentage will outlive the day than outlived yesterday. So really there is no point in patronizing the late Miss Libbey, who after all scribbled and scribbled to quite as much purpose. She gratified the need of the moment, and one read her novels very much as a hungry man eats carrots, because they are handy. We speak now of the elect, of the literati as distinguished from her followers. For have her followers she did. And she bequeathed them, wittingly or otherwise. All those Victorian romanticists bequeathed their partisans, or rather that self-perpetuating sentiment which begs not so much for fact as for fancy, and not so much for truth as for dream fulfillment. Miss Libbey's feminine readers used to sniff vinegar for their asthma while they tripped—in fancy—lightly over the lead, with the fascinating stranger in pursuit. And her masculine readers, they forgot their obvious liabilities, and conversed—in fancy—with elegant distinction. And all went well, eventually, and that sort of thing. To whom did they bequeath their following you ask? Why, presumably, to Harold Bell Wright.

Republican Ticket and Platform

The Jackson County Republican organization is composed of fifty-six precinct committeemen, an executive committee of eleven members, a women's advisory committee of eleven members, one woman member of the state executive committee, a state committeeman, a congressional committeeman, making a total of eighty-one members who are the lawfully constituted representatives of the republican party in Jackson county. These men and women believe in party government, party responsibility, and party discipline, for no political organization can long endure, nor can it be of any great force or effect in elevating our standards of public service unless it is willing to assume full responsibility for its acts and stands ready to enforce discipline and demand loyalty when the majority speaks. The organization is in politics only from the standpoint of better government.

The following resolution was unanimously adopted at our meeting on October 7th. It is both a pledge and a platform:

Under the election laws of the state of Oregon, a county committee is elected by the people at the primary at the same time the candidates are nominated, and this committee is given full authority to take charge of the campaign for election.

This committee is made responsible for the conduct of the campaign; it is empowered to levy assessments on the candidates and to otherwise raise funds for proper and legitimate campaign expenses. The powers of this committee given both by law and by implication are almost unlimited. Therefore, be it

Resolved, that the Jackson County Republican Central Committee exercise in every just and reasonable way in this campaign the full powers given them by law.

Believing in party government and party responsibility, we therefore pledge to the people of Jackson county that if they see fit to elect our candidates on the 4th day of November, then this organization will get behind these county officers and encourage and support them in every way, so long as they conduct their respective offices in an able, economical and honest manner, and if they prove unworthy in the conduct of their offices, we should charges of inefficiency or dishonesty be preferred against any such officer and if upon investigation are found to be true, then this committee pledges the people of Jackson county that we will ask for the removal of any such officer, and, if necessary, take steps to remove him.

Further, if these candidates are endorsed at the polls this fall, then this harmony is resolved to see that the county is brought up to the court house at Jacksonville and that all of these officers pull together for efficiency in our county government, to the end that the burdens of the taxpayers may be relieved to as great an extent as possible.

We further pledge ourselves to see that unnecessary deputies, special police and other special officers and any unnecessary members of the clerical force not absolutely necessary for the efficiency conduct of county business, shall be cut off.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT

FIXES ALL RATES

To provide rules, classifications and rates of payment by employers and employees, according to the degree of danger in the different occupations. The commission would be the sole judge of the degree of danger; it may fix the rates of payment according to its pleasure, and change them likewise. The menace to workmen and employers is equally serious. Either may be favored or penalized, according to the inclination of the commissioners in power and their view as to the needs of the state fund. There is no limit, maximum or minimum, and no rule of fairness or uniformity which the commission must observe. It may favor one class of employers or workmen, and penalize another, as flagrantly and as often as it sees fit; and there is no redress.
