**BEAUTY DOCTOR WARNS OF DAMAGE DONE BY HAIR DYE**

CHICAGO, Nov. 3.—Gray-haired women who dye their hair are in constant danger from poisonous chemicals contained in the coloring which damage the scalp, impair the eyesight and permanently injure the hair, according to Neal R. Andrews, New York beauty expert, in an address here before a convention of hairdressers.

"Mercury, arsenic, lead, compounds of silver, pyrogallie acid, nitric acid and paraphenylenediamine, according to a recent bulletin issued by the American Medical Association", said Mr. Andrews, "are among the chemicals which form the ingredients of many commercial hair dyes. "The most dangerous is paraphenylenediamine. France, Germany and Austria recognized its destructive character and years ago prohibited its use. But they have not hesitated to manufacture it for export to America, where it is widely used for hair and fur dyes. Placed in contact with the skin its poisonous properties immediately manifest themselves."

**MINE EXPLOSIONS MOST FREQUENT IN MORNING HOURS**

WASHINGTON, Nov. 3.—If you must visit a coal mine don't go between 6 and 7 o'clock in the morning and 3 to 7 o'clock in the evening.

A review of 265 explosions, which have occurred in the coal mining industry within the last fifteen years, disclosed that the majority of the disasters occurred during these periods. According to the review completed by engineers of the Bureau of Mines of the Department of Interior, the danger of gas igniting in these intervals is greater than at any other time during the day, hanging upon the practice of shot-firing in the evenings.

Of the 256 disasters studied by Bureau of Mines engineers, it was found 4,413 men were killed and 570 others injured. As a result of the study the Bureau urged that extra vigilance be exercised in coal-mining operations during these danger periods to prevent unnecessary loss of life. Particular care should be taken in morning, it states, when most

of the worst explosions on record have occurred, largely due to the accumulation of gas during the night.

It is the practice in most mines, the Bureau states, for fire bosses to make gas examinations every morning before the mine crews enter the pits. Sometimes, however, owing to the number of places to inspect, or the unwillingness of the examiner to examine dangerous places, gas accumulations are overlooked.

The period elapsing between the time of an inspection and when the mine crews enter the mines is often too long, the Bureau continues, and a working place which may be free of mine gas when examined may refill with gas during the intervening period.

Many of the accident in the coal-mining industry, the report states are often caused by careless miners, who disregard work-

ing places which have been marked as being gassy and unsafe to work in.

One fairly frequent cause of morning explosions, the report states, is the leaving of ventilating doors ajar during the night. The air current is short-circuited thereby, and some workings will receive no fresh air, consequently gas rapidly collects, and the first man with an open light to approach sets it off.

In the afternoon and evening many explosions occur. It is noticeable that the number declines at 4 o'clock in the afternoon. In mines where the miners do their own shot-firing, or when it is done by shot-firing foremen during the

shift, one shot at a time, the firing would be completed at that time.

Monday morning is also regarded by the Bureau of Mines engineers as an unsafe time to enter mines. Numbers of disastrous explosions have occurred on that day. These explosions were caused chiefly by the stoppage of ventilation fans over the week-end, and the engineers recommended they should always be kept working, and, if stopped for any cause, the mine should be fully ventilated and tested on Mondays before

mine crews are allowed to enter.

The review also recommended that the areas assigned to fire bosses should not be too extensive. One explosion which occurred recently, taking a toll of nearly a hundred lives, was without doubt caused by the evident inability of fire bosses to inspect this section.

Well-appointed ventilation doors electrical cap lights, instead of the old coal-oil lights, and strict inspection of all electrical equipment to prevent short circuits which might cause explosions, were also recommended.
